LSS Security Update - August 31, 2013

The LSS Security Committee continues to prepare and train for the unexpected.

Harvey Stein, LSS's head of security attended this week's NYPD annual High Holiday security briefing at One Police Plaza. He was able to make personal connections with key NYPD counterterrorism leaders. Commissioner Raymond Kelly announced that there will be increased foot patrols and counterterrorism teams around the city. Some synagogues will receive unannounced visits from the NYPD's Hercules units. You've seen them outside LSS many times - dressed in black with K-9 dogs and heavily armed with automatic weapons.

Our shul's Local Synagogue Volunteers (LSVs) continue to be trained and re-trained and completed an additional training this week.
