Erev Tisha B'Av the LSS Israel Action Committee issued a community appeal for donations for the Sheba Medical Center at Tel Hashomer. The response of the community has been overwhelming. So far, over \$14,000 has been collected! Where does the money go? Here is a recent press release from the Medical Center:

"The Sheba Medical Center at Tel Hashomer has now treated over 100 Israel Defense Forces soldiers who were wounded on the battlefields in Gaza. Fifty soldiers are still hospitalized at Sheba, half of whom have moved from our acute care hospital into our rehabilitation hospital. We are expecting the influx of many additional soldiers for rehabilitation, from other hospitals around the country. Among the wounds are a significant number of complicated hand injuries. Our orthopedic hand surgeons, led by our world-famous hand surgeon Dr. Batya Yaffe, have performed multiple sophisticated surgeries, involving delicate vascular and muscle reconstructions."

# Senior Hamas Official Says Group Abducted Israeli Teens

A top Hamas official said members of his militant group kidnapped three Israeli teenagers whose deaths in June provoked a spiral of violence that led to the war in Gaza, the first acknowledgement of the movement's involvement. Hamas has up to now refused to confirm or deny Israeli accusations that it masterminded the abduction and killing of the three young men, one of them a joint U.S.-Israeli citizen, in Hebron. Speaking at a conference in Istanbul, Saleh al-Arouri, a Hamas official from the West Bank who lives in exile in Turkey, appeared to confirm Israeli allegations that the Islamist group was behind the teenagers' abduction. "The popular will was exercised throughout our occupied land, and culminated in the heroic operation by the Qassam Brigades in imprisoning the three settlers in Hebron," he said, referring to Hamas's armed wing. Israel said a third suspect arrested by its security forces admitted under interrogation to organizing the kidnapping with funds from Hamas in Gaza.
