Doctors in Israel Quietly Tend to Syria's Wounded August 9, 2013

Fighting between Syrian government forces and the rebels continues to rage close to the Golan Heights. Scores of Syrian casualties have been discreetly brought to Israel, an enemy country, for lifesaving treatments. Many of these people presumably were involved in the fighting. But in recent weeks there have been more civilians with blast wounds, including children who have arrived traumatized. Dr. Masad Barhoum, the director general of the Western Galilee Hospital in Nahariya, six miles south of the Lebanese border, said he was proud of the level of treatment his teams could provide and proud to be a citizen of a country that allowed him to treat every person equally. When a 13-year-old girl and her aunt were asked what they will say when they go home, the aunt replied: "I won't say that I was in Israel. It is forbidden to be here, and I am afraid of the reactions."
