
Chazzan Yanky Lemmer will again be leading the services next week.



Insights into the weekly Parsha and other matters at the heart of the LSS community

This week, as we are mid-way between Purim and Pesach, we read *Parshat Hachodesh*. Inasmuch as the special *aliyah* which we read begins with the words: "This month shall be first among all the months of the year", the concept of the sanctification of time is often understood to be the major theme of this Shabbat. This is particularly true because one of the many things a slave does not possess is time.

I submit, however, that there are several other revolutionary messages which this Torah reading imparts to us. Initially, to this point, every single task which led to the exodus from Egypt had been performed by Moses and Aaron. Now suddenly, G-d says to the people: Hold on guys, the free ride is over. G-d tells the people, through Moshe and Aharon that from this point forward, YOU must participate actively in this process in order for you to reap the benefits of the miracles which I have performed. YOU (each and every one of you who is able) must get a sheep and bring it to your home. YOU must guard it for four days. YOU must slaughter it and spread its blood on the lintels — which is as much a sign for the Egyptians as it is for G-d. (In other words, you have to stand up for, and proclaim, your Judaism, and not try to hide it.)

And, as if that is not enough, not only do you have to worry about yourself, but YOU have to find out if your neighbor has a sheep of his own, and if he does not, YOU must invite him to partake of yours.

These sentences define and articulate principles which are at the very core of the Jewish experience. Ours is a participatory society. Everyone is expected to pull his or her own weight to the extent that he or she can and, just as importantly, to assist those who need help to make it over the finish line. A community requires the active involvement of all of its members.

If you do everything as G-d commanded, then, the "entire congregation of the assembled Jewish people" (ch. 12, v. 6) will slaughter their Paschal lambs, as one, on the evening before they depart from Egypt -- as a unified force. The power of mutual responsibility is palpable in the dictates of these sentences.

Moreover, after you have lived through this experience, YOU must convey its significance to future generations. YOU are to transmit first, abhorrence of even one man or one woman subjugating another human and you must impart the fact that no person may ever deny another the right to human dignity. Second, YOU must pass along to future generations your sense of gratitude to the Almighty for the miraculous way in which he restored your humanity. Maintaining traditions and bestowing them in a meaningful way to future generations are well recognized as focal points of Judaism.

Thus, at the heart of this week's special leyning are two mutually consistent messages: not only must we actively strive to sanctify time, we must also seize those moments which are presented to us to stand together with our brothers and sisters to work hard to make the world a better place for everyone.

Shabbat shalom and chaq sameach v'kasher.
