All in the Details

As we read about the Mishkan and priestly vestments, as well as the sacrifices brought on the Altar, I am struck by the seemingly endless detail that the Torah devotes to these esoteric topics. The Torah devotes two whole parshiyos – Terumah and Tetzaveh – to a comprehensive outline of God's commands regarding the these topics, and then it goes on to fill two more parshiyos - Vayakhel and Pekudei - with a detailed description of Moshe and Bnai Yisrael's execution of these commands. Why does the Torah – the extremely terse message from God to the Jewish people – devote so much time and space to telling us the exact dimensions of every holy vessel, the color of every thread in the High Priest's frock and the particulars of every inaugural sacrifice; would it not have been sufficient to leave these details to the oral tradition as is the case in so much of the Torah? And why would the Torah go even further and repeat these lengthy renditions?

This question reminds of a similar question raised by Rashi to Parshas Chayei Sarah (24:42). Rashi's comments concern the Torah's recounting of the miraculous story of Eliezer's search for a wife for Yitzchak. Curiously, the Torah not only tells us the story in detail, but goes on to have Eliezer repeat the story in full later in the parsha. Rashi asks why the Torah feels the need to repeat this story in detail, when many important areas of the Torah, such as the intricate and detailed laws of Shabbos, are only obliquely referenced in the Torah. Rashi answers that, "better are the words of the servant of the Patriarchs before God than the Torah of their children." While Rashi's meaning is not self-evident, I think that it can be interpreted in way that also explains why the Torah devotes so much space to the Mishkan.

Perhaps Rashi is saying that people understand the importance of the details of Shabbos and accept that every intricate law has its place, but people find it more difficult to accept that in the area of human relations such detail is so critical. While people would accept that a legal text or topic should be scrutinized and analyzed because every law has been written towards some purpose and has some relevance, they would be less inclined to scrutinize a story for every detail - even though in reality each detail of a great person's actions may be critical because it may indicate the correct way to serve Hashem. The Torah may be correcting this tendency by making a point of repeating every detail of Eliezer's tale.

Similarly, one could suggest that people have a tendency to overlook the importance of detail in the divine service in the Mishkan. Specifically, people often think that such service is chiefly about thoughtful devotion. Furthermore, even if people accept that true devoutness must be concretized into action they often believe that it is not the details of the activity that matter, but rather the overall principles that the actions represent. While there is no question that this "big picture" perspective contains much truth – after all prophets such as Yirmiyahu chastised the Jewish people for focusing on the details rather than the spirit of the divine service (see for example Yirmiyah 7:21 -23) – the parshiyos of the Mishkan focus on detail. Perhaps the Torah spells out such detail, and even repeats the details, in order to stress that God not only wants our sincerity and our dedication to overarching principles, but actually cares about details such as the dimensions of the Mishkan, the specific priestly vestments and each of the inaugural sacrifices.
