This Shabbat we are fulfilling the command of remembering Amalek. The Torah tells us about the events that led to the command to destroy Amalek in the book of Shmot.

וַיֹּאמֶר ה' אֶל מֹשֶׁה כְּתֹב זֹאת זִבֶּרוֹן בַּסֵּפֶּר וְשִׂים בְּאָזְנֵי יְהוֹשֻׁעַ כִּי מָחֹה אֶמְחֶה אֶת זֵכֶר עֲמָלֵק מְתַּחַת הַשַּׁמֵים: וַיִּבֵן מֹשֶׁה מִזִבֵּח וַיִּקְרָא שִׁמוֹ ה' נִסִּי: וַיֹּאמֵר כִּי יָד עַל כֵּס יַהּ מִלְחַמָּה לַה' בַּעַמֵּלֵק מִדּר דֹר:

Hashem said to Moses, "Write this as a reminder in the Book and repeat it carefully to Joshua. I will totally obliterate the memory of Amalek." Moses built an altar and named it "Hashem is my banner". He said "The hand is on the Divine throne. Hashem will be at war with Amalek for all generations."

In Devarim the command is given to the Jewish people to wipe out the memory of Amalek while never forgetting about them. The commandment to remember Amalek is fulfilled by hearing the reading of this portion on Parshat Zachor.

Therefore, when Hashem gives you peace from all the enemies around you in the land that Hashem is giving you to occupy as a heritage, you must obliterate the memory of Amalek from under the heavens. You must not forget.

In the book of Samuel we learn of the attempt to fulfill the commandment to destroy Amalek. It is the message that we recall on Parshat Zachor.

Thus said the Lord of hosts, I remember that which Amalek did to Israel, how he waited in the path for him when he came up from Egypt. Go and strike Amalek, and completely destroy all that they have, sparing nothing; but slay both man and woman, toddler and infant, ox, and sheep, camel and donkey.

The repeated demands that Amalek be destroyed appear at first glance to be similar to the beliefs of Islamic radicals who claim a religious license to kill all those who fail to confirm to the demands of Islam. Judaism, however, is different - It has used historical reality to change religious norms. In the Talmud Berachot, all of the nations mentioned in the Torah are effectively declared to be non-existent - thus relieving us and future generations from the requirement of annihilating nations.

Sennacherib king of Assyria long ago went up and mixed up all the nations, as it says, "I have removed the bounds of the peoples and have robbed their treasures and have brought down as one their mighty inhabitants;"

Because of the passing of time, a previously demanded action was changed to a more metaphoric concept. As Rabbi Joseph B. Solove-itchik noted in his book "Kol Dodi Dofek" -

"In the name of my father (of blessed memory)... the notion of "the Lord will have war against Amalek from generation to generation" is not confined to a certain race, but includes a necessary attack against any nation or group infused with mad hatred that directs its enmity against the community of Israel. When a nation emblazons on its standard 'Come, let us cut them off from being a nation so that the name of Israel shall no longer be remembered' (Psalms 83:5), it becomes Amalek."

This year, the yahrtzeit of my father Harav Moshe ben Eliyahu 'jiis commemorated on Taanit Esther. He moved to Israel in 1966, was there during the '67 War, and passed away in Jerusalem in 1976. He was a passionate follower of the teachings of Rabbi Soloveitchik, and he devoted his life to strengthening Orthodox Judaism as a legitimate tradition in the modern world. May his memory be blessed.
