## May 20th and beyond

Shabbat, May 20th—BMOB is pleased to present Dr. Marc Shapiro as our Scholar in Residence, Shabbat May 20th. Dr. Shapiro will speak 3 times during Shabbat day: After Mussaf his topic will be "My Correspondence with the Gedolim: A Thirty Year Story", Shabbat Afternoon at 6:50PM, Dr. Shapiro will speak on "Rabbi Shlomo Goren, the Revolutionary Chief Rabbi" and at Seudah Shlisheet the topic will be "Was Rav Soloveitchik a Zionist?" All are welcome to attend.

Sunday, May 21st, 11am-Chavi and Ari Satz have been separated for almost five years and have been civilly divorced since October 2020. In July 2022, the Vaad Hadin V'Horaah of New City issued a psak (ruling), stating that Ari is a sarvan ladin (refusing to submit to beis din) and that he is chayav (obligated) to issue a get to Chavi. Ari has thus far disregarded this psak and refused the beis din's directive to give Chavi a get, leaving her an agunah (chained woman). The Rabbinical Council of Bergen County (RCBC) issued a statement prohibiting Ari from entering all RCBC-affiliated shuls and asking the community to abide by Harchakos DeRabenu Tam (distancing measures). Case advocates at ORA, the Organization for the Resolution of Agunot, have connected with Ari over the phone, attempting to resolve this situation amicably, but he has made it clear that he does not wish to work with them. ORA has also tried speaking with Ari's parents, Avromi and Frances Satz, hoping that they would encourage their son to listen to the psak of beis din, but they have not reciprocated ORA's outreach efforts. Rabbi Neal Turk, Rav of Bais Medrash of Bergenfield, also tried speaking with Mrs. Frances Satz but she refused to help work towards a resolution. Please join us in a peaceful protest in front of Ari's parents' home at 38 Carlton RD Monsey, NY 10952 to persuade Ari to give the get. Get-refusal is a form of domestic abuse and cannot be tolerated within our community. We must make it clear to Ari and his family that his behavior is abusive and unacceptable.
