A MESSAGE FROM RABBI ADLER



Chaveireinu HaYikarim,

I hope you and your family are well . There is a concept in Halacha that for certain halachot that Sunday, Monday and Tuesday are somehow connected to the previous week's parsha and Wednesday, Thursday and Friday are associated with the parsha to be read the next Shabbat. For example, the Halacha states that if you failed to make Havdalah on Saturday night, you can still recite it until Tuesday evening. I had been thinking about the dvar Torah for this upcoming weekly brief on Sunday and Monday and, therefore, I take the license to share another thought

related to parshat Korach, instead of Parshat Chukat.

When HKBH wants to strike out against Korach and his cohorts, He tells Moshe to inform the nation קרח דתן ואבירם למשכן קרח that they should leave the area of the Tabernacle of Korach. When Moshe relays the command, he substitutes instead, סורו נא מעל אהלי האנשים האלה, to leave the area of the tents of these wicked people. Why does G-D select the term Mishkan Korach? Yahadut has certain tasks reserved for designated people. There are responsibilities and restrictions for Kohanim that don't apply to Leviim and the remainder of Am Yisrael. Prior to the sin of the golden calf, the first born, bechorim, were the designated group to serve in the Mikdash. Korach tried to challenge this by stating that everyone is equally holy. These designations apply to places as well. The Mishneh in Masechet Keilim identifies a difference in Kedusha between Eretz Yisrael and Chutz L'Aretz, between the Har HaBayit and Yerushalayim, and between various locations on the Har HaBayit. When we enter upon the Har HaBayit, we are extremely careful not to trespass on areas currently restricted. Korach challenged not only the idea of different levels of personal Kedusha but locations as well. There was no necessity to have a Sanctuary or Temple to which one would come to worship G-D. Everyone's house could be a Mishkan and there is no necessity to come to the Beit HaMikdash or to shul. Therefore , HKBH uses the word משכן קרח because it reflected Korach's true intention. But in truth, a backyard or private home will never be recognized as a Beit Knesset or Beit Midrash. We certainly required our back and front yards during Covid when our shul was not available. However, בחסדי השם , with the vaccination, we can return to our מקדש מעט. Respectfully, I ask everyone to consider the transition to shul over the next few weeks. My request includes not only Shabbat morning, but Mincha and Maariv as well. As Rambam tells us that on account of the אדם לבית הכנסת , לפיכך לעולם יהא רץ , that Kedushat beit HaKnesset is limited to shuls. Shabbat Shalom,

Dear Friends,

It's so wonderful to be able to continue welcoming so many more members back to shul, and to welcome new members to our community. Last Shabbat it was wonderful to see so many members at the kiddush and we look forward to more kiddushim after the "three weeks" as we say thank you to the Adlers on July 31st and welcome the Strauchlers on August 7th.

Even though elementary school ends this week, we will be having youth groups throughout the summer. Groups on Shabbat morning begin at 9am and run through the end of that minyan.

In this week's parsha, Chukat, we read about Bnei Yisrael arriving in Kadesh and were without water. Moshe spoke to Hashem and Hashem said to speak to the rock, Moshe and Aaron gather the people. Then Moshe says: "Listen now, you rebels, shall we bring you water out of this rock?" Then "Moshe raised his arm and struck the rock twice with his staff" (Num. 20:10-11). The commentators disagree as to which aspect of Moshe's behavior was wrong: His anger? His act of striking the rock instead of speaking to it? The implication that it was he and Aaron, not God, who were bringing water from the rock? "In the first month the whole Israelite community arrived at the Desert of Zin, and they stayed at Kadesh. There Miriam died and was buried." (Num. 20:1)

In Gemara Taanit 9a we learn that in Miriam's merit Bnei Yisrael had water in the desert. She passed away and the water ceased. Rabbi Jonathan Sacks z'l explains this connection so beautifully. Miriam wasn't just Moshe's sister. She was there for him since the beginning, watching him in the Nile, in Pharaoh's home. She was the background presence through much of the narrative with Moshe. She was his support and no leader can lead alone, they need a support family and friends to be successful.

A careful reading of this famous episode in the context of Moshe's early life suggests that Miriam was Moshe's "trusted friend," his confidante, the source of his emotional stability, and that when she was no longer there, he could no longer cope with crisis as he had done until then.

May we all be so lucky to have a "Miriam" in our lives as we navigate the various challenges life brings and may we be understanding and compassionate and be like Miriam when others are facing their own challenges.
