A MESSAGE FROM RABBI ADLER

Chaveireinu HaYikarim,

I hope you and your family are well and that you had a meaningful Shavuot. As we do every Yom Tov, the Kohanim blessed both days of Yom Tov. Aside from the fulfillment of the mitzvah of Birchat Kohanim, it fulfills a second idea as well. The Gemara in Masechet Berachot (55B) states

that if one had a bad dream and cannot comprehend its significance, one should stand while the Kohanim are reciting Birchat Kohanim in shul and pray to HaShem that he had a dream which was troubling him and beg for to interpret it favorably. If one takes a peek in the Rambam, one notices that he omitted this Halacha and a second one with a similar twist. There are those who claim that Rambam did not take dreams seriously and hence, there is no need to worry about them. That is not correct. Rambam, in his commentary to the fourth perek, in Mishneh Avodoh Zara, tells us that the spirits, Amulets or magic have no significance and as a result, one should never consult them at all. However, he does not include dreams in that list. Furthermore, in Chapter One of Hilchot Taanit, Rambam says that if you were overcome with a bad dream, you should fast and engage in doing teshuva. So why does he omit the Halacha of dream analysis in Birchat Kohanim?

There are a variety of answers but I share with you an answer suggested by Rav Baruch Epstein, well known halachist and darshan. He claims that the Rambam simply forgot the Halacha. And that does not sully his reputation. He authored one of the most respected books ever written. But he was a human being. Only about G-D can we say *כי אין שכחה לפני כסא כבודך*, that there is no forgetfulness when we speak of Him. Even Moshe Rabbeinu acknowledged that he learned a Halacha from the Ribbono shel Olam and admitted that he forgot it. Moshe Ben Maimon can do the same and so can we all.

This has been a very difficult week for the Jewish people all across the world. This week we will hear Parshat Nasso. *Rabbi Sacks, z"l*, explains that Parshat Nasso tells us that we have to go the extra mile in bringing peace between husband and wife, between leaders of the community, and among laypeople who aspire to a more-than-usual state of sanctity.

It is no accident therefore that the priestly blessings end – as do the vast majority of Jewish prayers – with a prayer for peace. Peace, said the rabbis, is one of the names of God himself, and Maimonides writes that the whole Torah was given to make peace in the world (Laws of Hanukah 4:14). Nasso is a series of practical lessons in how to ensure, as far as possible, that everyone feels recognized and respected, and that suspicion is defused and dissolved.

We have to work for peace as well as pray for it.

Shabbat Minyanim Update

- There will be **vaccinated sections in the Main Shul and in the Beit Midrash**. These sections are only for members who are at least two weeks past their final vaccines, or for members who have recovered from COVID within the past 3 months. At least one seat should be left empty between pods in the vaccinated seating.
- There will be a **socially distant section** where every third row will be available. Multiple pods may sit in one row, but when selecting seats please leave at least 3 seats between different seated pods in your row. This will enable the Main Shul to maintain the required 6 foot distancing in the unvaccinated sections.

An Introduction to Rabbinic Decision-Making

The “science” of halachic decision-making in cases of factual doubt is the backbone of much of *pesak halacha*. It relies on legal presumptions based on time-honored rules such as *rov*, *hazakah*, *safek d'oraita lechumra* and *safek d'rabanam lekula*.

This field is the subject of famed works of Achronim such as the *Ktzot Hachoshen*, *Avnei Miluim*, *Netivot Hamishpat*, *Kuntres Hasfekot* and *Tekafo Kohein*. The author of the *Ktzot* and the *Avnei Miluim* (R. Aryeh Leib Heller) is also known in yeshiva circles for his שבע (7 essays). All of Rabbi Heller's works have gone through many editions and all still serve as the cornerstones of Torah learning in yeshivot, despite the radical changes in method effected in Lithuanian yeshivot through R. Hayyim Soloveitchik.

In this series, Congregation Rinat Yisrael of Teaneck, New Jersey presents, via Zoom, seven (7) master teachers of Talmud – each speaker will focus his or her presentation on one of the numbered divisions of the שבע. While each presentation is independent of the others, the seven shiurim taken as a whole will give our audience a broad introduction to analytic yeshiva learning and to halachic theory as seen through the prism of a work which is a perennial classic of the Torah world.

An Evening with Julie Metz,
Author of the Memoir
Eva and Eve

Sunday June 6 @8pm

Julie Metz will be discussing her new memoir, "Eva and Eve." Metz's mother Eve seemed like a typical Manhattanite, and she rarely spoke of her early life and harrowing childhood in Nazi-occupied Vienna. After she passed away, Metz found a keepsake book filled with farewell notes from friends and relatives addressed to a young girl named Eva. This long-hidden memento was the first clue to the secret pain that Metz's mother carried as a refugee and immigrant. "Eva and Eve" vividly traces Metz's search for her mother's lost childhood.

Julie Metz is the author of the newly released memoir *Eva and Eve* and the New York Times bestselling memoir *Perfection*, a Barnes & Noble Discover Great New Writers Selection. Sevilla had the second largest Jewish population in the world during the Middle Ages, and is the city that Jews settled when they returned to Spain in 1860 after almost 400 years of absence.

Moisés Hassán-Amselém, born in Seville of Moroccan and Algerian heritage, is a honorary lecturer on Holocaust-Shoa Studies and Antisemitism at the University "Pablo de Olavide" in Seville, Spain.

Raised in a very traditional Sephardic family, he attended the University of Seville, obtaining a law degree in 1995. However, and after several years working in many different fields (Telecom industry, legal consultancy, scrap metal industry...) he decided to make a complete career change and focus on Jewish studies and mainly in the history of the Jews in Spain and the Sephardic diaspora.

In addition to his role at the University "Pablo de Olavide", Moisés is involved in informal Jewish education and lectures all over about these topics.

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
