**A MESSAGE FROM RABBI STRAUCHLER**

WAR, PEACE, AND IDENTITY

"The strongest of all warriors are these two – Time and Patience."

— Leo Tolstoy, War and Peace

After making the request to peacefully pass through the land of *Edom*, *Bnei Yisrael* are rebuffed by the threat of war:

וַיֹּאמֶר אֱלֹהֵי אֲדוֹם לֹא תַעֲבֹר בִּי פֶן־בְּחַרְבִּי אֶצְאָ לְקִרְאֲתֶיךָ:

But Edom answered him, "You shall not pass through us, else we will go out against you with the sword." (20:18)

The Bal HaTurim comments,

פֶּן בַּחֲרָב אֶצְאָ לְקִרְאֲתֶךָ וְהֵייוּ דְכֹתִיב אֲנִי שְׁלוֹם וְכִי אֲדַבֵּר הֵמָּה לְמַלְחָמָה:

"About this was it written in psalms, 'I am peace, yet when I speak they are for war.'" Somehow, the very attempt to speak – to make an offer for peaceful co-existence – can become a pretext for war.

The ability to claim like in David Hamelech – *ani shalom* – I am peace – is crucial for our self-understanding. The inner strength to say these words allows "the time and patience" to succeed in longer struggles. That's what makes "time and patience" the strongest of all warriors. We are and must remain a peaceful people. Even as we recognize *hemah lamilchama* – even as we remain prepared to defend ourselves, we must neither glorify violence nor define ourselves by war.
