A MESSAGE FROM RABBI STRAUCHLER

DAVENING OFF A CELL PHONE

We often kiss our siddur after davening. Have you ever seen someone kiss their smartphone after using it for davening?

Technology allows us to use our phones as siddurim. Yet, these devices are used for many other things. It would be odd for us to kiss the screen that we also use to check our e-mails and review the latest

news update. We designate our siddurim as *sifrei kodesh* – holy books; we don't feel the same way about our devices. This raises an interesting problem. Is it proper to use our smartphones as siddurs, if we use these very same devices for such mundane purposes?

One might say, "No, we must separate the pure from the non-pure." Generally, we should prefer to use a traditional siddur for our prayers and only use our smart-devices in extenuating circumstances. (I once received a siddur in the mail when a friend who works for a publishing company saw me using a siddur app.) Another might say, "Just the opposite, we should regularly sanctify our device by using it for Torah study and prayer." We should take the mundane and "raise it up." The question surrounding the smartphone is a microcosm of the world, writ large. As Modern Orthodox Jews, we typically take the second approach. We try to imbue the mundane around us with *kedusha*.

Parsha Matot contains an insight in how we can better achieve this goal. When the Jewish people captured materials in battle with Moav, they brought them back to the camp. Elazar, the son of Aaron and the kohein gadol, instructed them in a series of procedures (libun, hagaala and tevilat kelim) by which they could cleanse and purify what they had captured. The Ramban comments:

אף הכלים שתשמישן בצונן צריכין הכשר מן האיסור שבהן מלבד הטבילה הזו ואיך לא יזכיר הכשרן כאשר עשה רראים ראש

Even those vessels, which are only used for cold things [of forbidden foods] need purification from [the traces of] their forbidden foods in addition to this immersion [which Rashi mentioned], and how can it be that Scripture [here] does not mention the [method] of purification [for such vessels] as it did with reference to those vessels that come into the fire?

It was not sufficient to remove forbidden flavors from the vessels; they also had to dedicate them to a higher purpose. Material things could be transferred over the border between the general world and the Torah world – but the transition required *tahara* – purification.

While I would not suggest passing your smartphone through fire or water, it is worth reflecting on the transition between the places we take our smartphones and where smartphones take us. When we shift between a prayer app and a mundane app, we should reflect on how we use this material thing. Technology collapses boundaries. Some of those boundaries might still serve a useful purpose in allowing us the freedom to choose pure from non-pure, meaningful from wasteful, and good from bad. May we merit to imbue our world with holiness, as we traverse these boundaries.
