A MESSAGE FROM RABBI STRAUCHLER

PURIFYING INTENTIONALLY



In my drasha last Shabbat, I emphasized the natural character of tuma. I decried the stigmatization of tuma - the attribution of control over tzaraat that spreads to all tragedy and disappointment. We have come to believe that we are in full control of our perfect lives - and if we are not - it is our fault. My message was that this is foolish and untrue, "We should lower unhealthy religious expectations." This may be true as peshat, but on the level of drash - Chazal have long interpreted tzaraat as indicative of sinfulness.

Ritual has a symbolic logic. A ceremony's repeated motions convey values both in terms of the ritual's purpose and the values of the society that performs that rite. This is true of our preparations for Pesach, and it is true of the purification ceremony that brought the person afflicted with *tzaraat* back home to his or her community.

One element of that purification ritual was the sacrifice of an *asham*, a sin offering. Blood from the sacrifice was sprinkled on the *metzorah's* right ear, right hand's thumb, and right foot's big toe. The lbn Ezra asks why the thumb and the ear are selected for this ritual. He explains:

טעמו ידוע ממקומו והנה המטהר מהצרעת שהוא בגוף כמו הכהן שימלא ידו כי העון כמו הצרעת בנפש והבהן מקום חבור והוא עקר כל המעשים והימנות בעבור כח הצד הימין והתנוך זכר לשמוע אשר צוה

Now, the one who is cleansed from leprosy, which is an affliction in the body, is similar to the kohen who is installed, for sin is like a leprosy in the soul. The thumb is the place of connection. It is the main component of all acts. The right thumb was selected because of the power of the right side. The tip of the ear is a reminder to listen to what God has commanded.

The source of *tzaraat* was a character failing. The choice of these body parts for the ritual teaches us about the nature of society. The ear is chosen because the ear first heard the command to abide by the laws of the Torah. The thumb is chosen because it is the location where we relate to others – the spot where we might grasp others and form physical connections.

When society breaks down, human contact itself requires purification. We don't only pour blood upon the altar, but also upon the body itself. The blood from the sacrifice purifies the specific areas that require attention. Our ability to listen and our ability to grasp on to others are the pathways for society's rebirth. As we feel our society's social norms breaking down, let us be a force for purification – by re-sanctifying our words as we rebuild connection one positive relationship at a time.


"The case of the Polish Jewish community"
