Most notably, the Torah portrays Eretz Yisrael as a land meriting the highest levels of Divine Providence: "Eini Hashem Elokecha ba." The "eyes" of Hashem focus especially on those fortunate enough to dwell in the King's Palace, and allow Him to provide accordingly.

But they also focus on each and every living being, "mi'beitzei kinnim ad karnei r'eimim." Acknowledge His constant providence in speech ("b'ezras Hashem," "im yirtzeh Hashem") and deed. And be grateful for His manifold

berachos- not least of which is a flourishing homeland pulsating with vibrant Jewish life and Torah study as never before. Happy Birthday Israel!






