







Menahel's Message "I'm Proud of You!"



Upon completing the construction of the various components of the Mishkan, Moshe Rabbeinu proffers a

beracha: "ויברך אותם משה". The purpose of this blessing, according to the Ralbag, was to encourage similar positive behavior in the future. Moshe Rabbeinu realized that B'nei Yisrael had invested much effort and resources in fashioning the Mishkan and its various keilim, and though they had participated willingly and enthusiastically, a little positive reinforcement would go a long way towards ensuring similar future efforts. And note, adds the Ralbag, that Moshe didn't even give them anything tangible as an inducement: by offering a beracha, he simply indicated his pleasure with their actions. The knowledge that the individual B'nei Yisrael most admired was pleased with them was itself a reward.

The late mashgiach, Harav Shlomo Wolbe, zt"l, would note that the proverbial shevet-rod- of "חושך שבטו שונא בנר", colloquially translated as "Spare the rod, spoil the child," need not be understood as strictly a rod of punishment, but may rather be interpreted as a metaphor for any provision of direction, includingand primarily-positive reinforcement.

Widespread research indicates that by and large, children most admire their parents. If that's the case, the best (and least expensive!) means of positive reinforcement may be for parents to simply tell their children how proud they make them. Give it a try.


