





















Assuming that their precious leader had died, the Jewish men created a golden calf and worshipped it. The women refused to participate in this horrendous act. When asked to contribute their jewelry, the women adamantly declined.

The Lubavitcher Rebbe explains that the women's actions were greater than a simple refusal. The Jews had just left a land deeply steeped in idolatry. When the men were challenged, they caved and followed the lessons taught to them by their Egyptian neighbors. The women's faith remained strong. To them, the idea of idol worship was unthinkable.





















