




Back to Basics

More than a physical day of rest, *kedushas Shabbos* represents a weekly opportunity for spiritual and emotional renewal, and thus the possibility of maintaining the sublime elevation of the recent Yomim Tovim throughout the year.

The basis of successfully doing so is hinted at in the word bereishis itself. According to the Gaon of Vilna, D"ekop is an acronym for six key aspects of one's relationship with Hashem, and his constant awareness of Him:

(IDO) - 'O Complete trust in the Ribbono shel Olam

pea |3 - 's Striving to fulfill His will

ລວລk - 'k Love of Hashem

ຈາງປ່ວ - 'e Silence, as in acceptance

ລໄ⊂ງ' - '¹ Awe of Hashem

. эಂಡು - '**b** Studying Torah, and living accordingly

While achieving perfection in even one of these six areas can take many lifetimes, an awareness of these basic goals is a good starting point, a "Bereishis."




As we plow through challenging times, we must rely on each other as we care for our most precious saplings. I look forward to watching them blossom and sharing much joint nachas!




We hosted a successful Parent workshop featuring an interactive tour to guide parents and help navigate through Google Classroom, ParentLocker and other aspects of virtual schooling.
