Menahel's Message Days Are Coming



The Gemara in Ta'anis relates that during the destruction of the first Beis Hamikdash, the youngest kohanim, the pirchei k'huna, cast the keys to the burning

Temple heavenward, lamenting their inability to serve as proper guardians for the holy site, whereupon a palm-like figure reached out from the sky to accept the keys.

While there is no doubt as to the sincerity of these pure young souls- to wit, the emergence of the miraculous palm- Rav Ahron Soloveitchik z"l suggests that their willingness to return the keys was misplaced. Doing so constituted an act of hopelessness, and while a Jew surrenders to the will of the Almighty, he doesn't give up. Ever. Perhaps, suggests Rav Ahron, the Beis Hamikdash would have been more quickly rebuilt had the pirchei k'huna not returned the keys.

When the first translated, hardcover editions of Kinnos were published several decades ago, a number of senior

Rabbonim were perturbed: why invest in a publication that is inherently irrelevant? Don't we believe that last year's Tisha B'Av was in fact the last one? And if no, why not?

Our current reality has ranged from tragic to challenging, but a Jew is fundamentally optimistic. When one reaches the beis din shel ma'alah, the Heavenly tribunal, after a life (hopefully) well-lived, he is asked whether he looked forward to Redemption, tzipisa l'yeshuah, not tzipisa l'Tisha B'Av.

Shabbos Nachamu celebrates the fact that while we unfortunately did not merit Redemption this Tisha B'Av, we believe that better times await, and look forward to the Yom Tov our collective teshuva and tefillos will undoubtedly warrant. L'alter l'teshuva, l'alter l'geulah!





aspects of the third Beis Hamikdash, focusing in particular on the detailed blueprint contained in the last eight chapters of Sefer Yechezkel. May





I am currently reading Lekutey Sichos from the Lubavitcher Reb-The Rebbe discusses various questions in the pesukim regarding




the Menorah in the Bais Hamik-By Rabbi Boruch Greenwald dash and explains how the Menorah must have seven different


