
The berachos of Yakov Aveinu to each of the twelve tribes represent not only a father's prophetic personal aspirations for each of his sons, but eternal lessons in priorities for all.

When blessing Asher, Yakov references the bountiful bread of his tribe's portion: "מאשר שמינה לחמו". For Asher, explains the Alshich Hakadosh, plentiful bread was apparently more than adequate. Yet note the same verse's concluding words: "הוא יתן מעדני מלף" - "And he shall give (to others) delicacies of kings." Asher was content to subsist on bread and other basic staples, but when it came to giving to others, only the choicest delicacies would do.

The Gaon of Vilna derives a similar lesson from the Torah's presentation of the *mitzvah* of *matza*. In commanding each Jew to personally eat *matzos*, *tochlu*, the word "מצת" is written חסר – without a vav: "בערב תאכלו מצת". Yet when commanding the obligation to ensure that matzos be eaten by others, *tocheilu* in the passive, *matzos* is spelled fully -שלאם - with a vav: "שבעת ימים מצות תאכלו". Skimp for yourself (chaser)- but no cutting corners (*maleh*) when it comes to others!

Food for thought.


















Antisemitism Op-Ed

The Holocaust, the merciless genocide of six million Jews, is unfortunately one of the many historic events that resulted in the terrorization and humiliation of Jews. Antisemitism has been alive and raging for more than 3,000 years; however, in recent years, acts of antisemitism have dramatically increased all over the world. How do we educate Neo-Nazis? The non-believers? The 12% of people who can't identify

what the Holocaust was? There's one obvious but crucial question: how do we diminish a whole belief system before the world erupts into meaningless hatred? I believe the answer lies in education, truth, and empathy. It is our job to prevent antisemitism from continuing to rise and stop people from believing the fallacies that are spread about the Jews.

Part of educating people about antisemitism requires understanding what antisemitism and Holocaust denial look like in the first place. In December of 2020, a white supremacist stood in our nation's capital wearing a shirt representing The Proud Boys Organization, an antisemitic and racist cult who are loud and firm in their beliefs. The shirt displayed 6MWE across his chest, essentially stating six million weren't enough, a manifestation of the extreme hatred that signifies antisemitism. Gavin McInnes, an iniquitous far-right activist, is the mastermind behind this horrid cult. In 2017, he filmed a video in The Holy Land, saying, "I felt myself defending the super far-right Nazis just because I was sick of so much brainwashing and I felt like going, 'Well, they never said it didn't happen. What they're saying is it was much less than 6 million and that they starved to death and weren't gassed, that they didn't have supplies." What Holocaust deniers believe is that gas chambers weren't used as a weapon, the only horrendous thing that happened was starving to death, and much more. Pictures, records, and videos prove the Holocaust did happen, so deniers twist the events and make it less than it was, and this tactic manipulates the world into believing their lies. This is dramatically more dangerous than completely denying the Holocaust, so it needs to be stopped now. There is one thing worse than the Holocaust being denied, and that's belittling it; Holocaust deniers often use this tactic to convince others to deny the truth. The way to combat this form of antisemitism is educating people about the truth.

Holocaust deniers walk the streets, sometimes hiding their antisemitism and other times wearing antisemitic shirts, or unfortunately increasingly lately protesting, injuring, and even shooting. However, there are some antisemites who are more powerful than the rest, and can influence others drastically. As the world becomes more futuristic and it evolves, celebrities and social media influencers tend to have a significant influence on what others believe and how they act.

Kanye West, now known as Yitler, admitted his love for the masochistic Adolf Hitler. Why does this matter: he's one man? He's one man who has millions of followers and can change the mindset of way too many people. Former president Trump hosted a white supremacist and Holocaust denier at his house, which also influences millions and millions of people. Lastly, basketball star Kyrie Irving promotes antisemitic films. Think of all of his fans, what will they think? As more powerful people come out with their hatred against the Jews, the more the world turns on them, and hatred engulfs the world.

This is just one example of the many instances of increasing antisemitism in the past five years, and it needs to be stopped. And stopped soon. And before it's too late and the entire world is utterly brainwashed. Educating antisemites, Neo-Nazis, or Holocaust deniers about the Holocaust is so important for reasons that are too many to count. The Holocaust needs to be taught and not only within the Jewish community, but worldwide. Not only will the Jews fight, but everyone who is educated will. That is why education of the Holocaust is crucial for the existence of the world.

Antisemitic violence, along with antisemitic statements, has been on the rise. In 2018, a white supremacist entered a synagogue screaming that the Jews must die, started shooting and killed 11 people. In 2019, an extremist posted on Passover an extremely antisemitic comment before killing a congregant in a Chabad synagogue. On the holiest day of the year, a gunman attempted to enter a synagogue, but failed so he killed two people on the street instead. These are just a few of the most major and violent results of antisemitism.

The Jews make up 0.2% of the world; however, this doesn't mean that just because we are smaller than most, we are weak. No, this makes us more powerful. The Holocaust shouldn't only be taught within Jewish schools, it needs to be spread globally. Educators need to include the Holocaust and results of antisemitism in their classes, people need to stand up for anyone who may be a victim of racism, and government officials need to be proven wrong and humbled. One way to spread awareness is through campaigns and signs conducted by students, Jewish or not.

The truth is only shown to the ones who will let themselves see. As I walked through the narrow streets of Hungary, I watched the citizens walk around peacefully. I looked at the vandalized buildings that were refurbished on top of the ghetto, I saw bolted signs on the walls of synagogues, and occasionally individuals would stop to look at the sign. How does antisemitism and racism end? Where does it end? What point does it have to get to for people to realize that it's gone too far? There shouldn't have to be a point, but since it's already existent, the world needs to use the good side of Hungary as an example. Seeing signs that raise awareness about the terrors that Hitler conducted and the results of antisemitism, slowly convince me the world might be slightly improving. Although people take pictures of these signs, remnants of the ghetto, or memorial sights, it's kept in one place, but it needs to be spread. Spread to Kanye West, Kyrie Irving, Trump, and Nick Fuentes, and the entire world.
