### Menahel's Message Prerequisite: Toroh



Upon learning that Yosef is alive and well in Egypt, Yaakov Avinu embarked on the formidable task of establishing an appropriate spiritual environment for his family. According to

Rashi, Yaakov sent Yehudah in advance of the rest of the family, in order to establish a beis talmud, a yeshiva, prior to the their arrival: "את יהודה שלח לפניו אל יוסףלהורות לפניו גושנה".

But why Yehudah? Why couldn't a yeshiva be established by Yosef Hatzadik, whose exceptional strength of character and righteousness had rendered him deserving of the 'tzadik' designation, a title not used for any of the other Avos or Shevatim?

The Lubavitcher Rebbe zt"l suggests that Yosef's unmatched tzidkus manifest itself in his ability to successfully navigate the challenges of Egyptian society and sanctify his surroundings, thus infusing his very physical environment with spiritually and holiness. Emulating Yosef's ability to create a dwelling place for Hashem in this world, a mador ba'tachtonim, is certainly a Jew's

ultimate goal, but doing so first requires a strong pure and unadulterated Torah foundation. Since Yehudah had presumably been more recently involved in intense, pure Torah study, he was a stronger candidate to establish a foundational beis talmud.

As parents and mechanchim, our goal is to guide our children towards adulthood as well-rounded and well-adjusted mekadshei shem shamayim capable of incorporating timeless Torah values into their own lives and those of others, thus forging a mador ba'tachtonim for our Creator. Pure, positive but intense Torah study is a prerequisite for this lofty goal.


