Menahel's Message Shofar of Hope

Many reasons are given for the mitzvah of tekias shofar, most focusing on the shofar as an inevitable wake up call. In the immortal words of

the Rambam,

עורו ישנים משנתכם ונרדמים הקיצו מתרדמתכם וחפשו במעשיכם" "Awaken from your slumber and return to Hashem."

R. Don Isaac Abarbanel, the great 15th century commentator and statesman, however, points to an additional- and often ignored- aspect of shofar. Yes, the shofar blasts remind us to awaken and repent, but they also offer hope and foretell a brighter future. Like the

blasts of the Yovel sounded on Yom Kippur of the fiftieth year that free slaves and restore ancestral property ownership, and like the blasts of the shofar gadol that will usher in the final redemption, the shofar of Rosh Hashana is a symbol of hope and a harbinger of better times ahead, albeit on a more limited scale. The shofar reminds us to never stop hoping: hoping for ourselves, our children and the world.

May the coming year be one of abundant beracha, hatzlacha and nachas, לנו ולבל ישראל!



The Lubavitcher Rebbe explains that the three sounds of the shofar represent three different types of Jews. The tekiah, represents the righteous Jew. The shevarim, represents the Jew that is devoid of Torah and mitzvos. The teruah, represents the struggling Jew. On Rosh Hashana, we never blow the sounds of shevarim and teruah unless they are surrounded by tekios. We never allow the shevarim and teruah Jews to stand alone in front of the heavenly court without being flanked by tekiah Jews. On Rosh Hashana, all types of Jews stand together ready to be judged.

This year, our girls are learning that they must stand together and help one another. They are learning to forge friendships and to be empathetic of others. They are learning to care for one another through words and actions.




