- To challenge each child and family member to ascend the ladder of Jewish commitment.

## **Religious School Policies**

Parents' attitude toward religious school affects a child's feelings and performance. Parents who did not have a positive Hebrew school experience may convey a negative attitude toward their children. Religious schools have changed greatly; ours offers stimulating and exciting learning activities. Please encourage your children to approach religious school as part of their overall education, to attend regularly, to be on time, and to come well equipped. We welcome your involvement in our many activities.

Congregation Agudath Israel Religious School is committed to promoting Judaism as an active force in the hearts and minds of our children. Our congregational community proudly regards our religious school as a top priority, and we reflect this commitment in our educational program. The following policies support our religious school objectives.

### **Attendance Policy**

We have so little time and so much to teach. It is important for our students to attend Religious School regularly. A youngster who is frequently absent has a difficult time keeping up and making progress. Excessive absences lower the status of Religious School in the eyes of the child and may negate our efforts to maintain standards. The following is our attendance policy:

1. A child who has had excessive absences will be required to make up work in order to complete the semester.
2. Parents will be alerted if there are excessive absences.
3. Please notify the school office if your child will be absent on any day.

### **Behavioral Expectations**

1. Class rules are explained and posted in every classroom.
2. Teachers develop a reward and consequence system for their classes.
3. If students are sent to the office, a phone call will be made to the parents.
4. The Principal will determine if it is necessary to have a conference for the student, parents, and teacher.
5. If the child's behavior does not improve, it may be determined that the child will need private tutoring at the parents' expense.
6. A behavior contract between the student, teacher, and Principal may be developed.
7. In the event that a student leaves the building without permission, does not attend class while in the building, physically harms another student, or damages school property, the student will be placed on probation. The students will be expected to do a set amount of community service, as determined by the Principal. In the event of another similar incident, the child will be removed from the classroom and will be required to have private tutoring at the parents' expense.

*The most important component of our discipline policy is parental support. Please help us create the best learning environment for our students.*

## Tzedakah

Tzedakah (money donated for charitable causes) is collected every class period. We ask our students to participate in this and other tzedakah-related projects in order to develop their sense of responsibility to other people and to the Jewish and general community. During the year, the Vav class serves as our *Va'ad Tzedakah*, Tzedakah Committee. Different institutions are selected to benefit from the tzedakah funds donated by our students.

## Drop off and Pick up Procedures

We are very concerned about the safety of your children. Please help us make the drop-off and pick-up as organized and safe as possible. Drop-off and pick-up will take place at our school entrance on Academy road.

All students will remain inside of the school during dismissal time. We will collect names of carpools fifteen minutes before the end of the day. These names will then be called out in order. No child will be permitted to leave for pick-up unless his/her car is in the line-up. This system requires a great deal of patience - please remember: Safety is always our first priority.

## Snacks and Allergies

**NOTE: Due to our kashrut and allergy policies please do NOT send additional snacks to school. Pretzels and occasional treats are given to the students. If students bring snacks, they will be asked to finish snacks outside of the building. Water bottles and fresh fruit are permitted.**

## Snow Days

Religious School is automatically cancelled when the Caldwell-West Caldwell Public Schools are cancelled.

In any other situation, as when the weather deteriorates during the day or the weather is bad on a Sunday morning, **an email will be sent and an update will be announced on our Facebook page and website.** Decisions regarding Shabbat programming will be made on Friday. Make sure that we have your correct email address, home and cell phone number and business number.
