With the start of the new Jewish year comes the reflecting on the year past and looking forward to what lies ahead. This is part of the Jewish tradition of "Cheshbon Hanefesh", the self-inspection, and reflection that takes up our collective energy at this point in the year culminating with Yom Kippur. As with every year, this one will have its own story and journey; each year turns, like a wheel, and as it returns around again, we look around and see what the journey has shown to us. The challenge for us is to do this reflection individually and together as a community. This year begins a transition for the congregation. The transition from my rabbinic leadership to the next one for this congregation. For me, it has been a blessing to serve the Temple Beth El community over the past seven years, and I look forward to the remaining time that we to spend together through next summer. I hope that you will find meaning in your personal reflection and meditation throughout this time of the year.

As we approach the High Holy Days, we will be joined by Rabbi YaffaShira Sultan once again as our cantorial soloist. She will be singing during services over Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur. There are many ways to engage in the spirit of the High Holy Days-- from meditations to chanting, to study, and prayer. More details about the High Holy Day schedule can be found within this Shofar. Sukkot, the Festival of Booths, and a way to reconnect with nature, begins soon after Yom Kippur and includes an interactive service and potluck dinner. All are invited to be a part of the celebrations.

Earlier in the year I was honored to be invited to join a group of rabbis on a mission to Israel. At the end of October, I will be in Israel with 9 other rabbis from different denominations- Reform, Conservative, and Orthodox- on a program sponsored by "Classrooms without Borders" called "Rabbis Engaging in Israel". The program is designed to help deepen rabbinic appreciation for the reality on the ground today and the issues confronting Israeli citizens from the religious-secular challenges, Israeli-Palestinian, and in particular, challenges in education. The select size of the delegation allows for access to areas and leaders that would not otherwise be possible, as well as a way of building strong connections with the participating rabbis. I look forward to sharing some of what I learn on this program with you upon my return.
