"If I am not for myself, who will be? If I am only for myself, who am I? If not now, when?" Hillel in Mishnah Avot

Shalom friends

Light begins to return at this time of the year and the energy begins to shift. The quote above is one of my personal favorites. I think in this case, it can apply to many parts of this next month. In a global sense, we are seeking to respond in a supportive way to the numerous conflicts that have led to a staggering refugee crisis in Europe and the need for effectively and responsibly resettling the immigrants. The above quote can help frame one perspective on this issue. "If I am not for myself, who will be? If I am only for myself, who am I? If not now, when?" Quite simply unpacked, we can understand this teaching of Hillel if we put ourselves in the position of the "I" voice in this manner: The first question in this circumstance asks how do we protect our country, our homes, effectively. Then logically we cannot only think of ourselves, for we are all part of one world, of one Creator. Therefore, the second statement places before us the idea of the imperative to care for others. Finally, after we assess the balance between self-need and selfless action, it is time to take needed action without delay.

It is vitally important that we continue to protect the citizens who already reside in the countries of resettlement, including the United States, and it is also important to aid those who are fleeing the violence. I do not have the answers but I do know that this is an issue that is important to consider and to use our values to understand better how to act. Judaism has a strong foundation in righteous action and aiding the "other." HIAS, the Hebrew Immigration Aid Society, is one organization currently on the ground in Europe that has helped many people the world over escape from places of danger and violence to resettlement in new lands; some of us in the community may have family that were resettled by HIAS in this country after the Holocaust or other world events. They have good resources for understanding the resettlement of refugees in general and particular to this circumstance. This is one way that we can learn how to help those who are suffering in this situation get supported and lifted.

On January 16-17, Temple Beth El will be hosting the third MLK "shul-in" Jewish teen overnight. Here, the teens come together and build community face to face. With a generous grant from the Jewish Federation of Delaware, this program includes Jewish identity activities, games, social action projects, in addition to the overall fun in being together in an informal setting. The program uses the Temko building as the main area of activities for the teen program. It is open to any Jewish teen (8-12th grade). Contact the TBE office to register.

Sunday January 17 will be our Mitzvah Day at TBE. This is a morning of hand-on activities some of which directly benefit our congregation and some of which will help benefit other agencies or individuals in need. Part of the school program day will include participating in these activities. Thanks to the great support of our volunteers this program has something for everyone who wants to participate. When we all do a little, it can create a large amount of help and when we help in community, we all benefit.

Adult education this month will be a two part session on Islam. Part one on the history and part two looking at some shared texts. This is one way that we can deepen our understanding of Islam and its culture and perhaps begin to create bridges to the local Islamic community that may be a benefit to all.

In light of the events that have occurred around the country and the world, it is important that you know that Temple Beth El cares greatly about your safety and well-being. While we do have security cameras and signs posted, which are deterrents, we all need to be vigilant and let our synagogue office know immediately if you spot anything or anyone who looks suspicious while you are visiting with us.

Do not hesitate to call 911, if you are concerned about something or someone while in our buildings or parking lot.

As of 12/30/15, the front doors will be the only entrance into the main building. The kitchen door will only be used for deliveries in which a code will be required. If you have business in the kitchen and are in need of assistance, please contact the front office. Our Synagogue Administrator will be more than happy to share the code with those that need to make deliveries or come during non-business hours; however, this will need to be pre-arranged. Rachel Mussaf can be reached at [\(267\)879-8528](tel:2678798528). The kitchen code will be changed on a weekly basis. Please do not share the code with anyone. If someone asks you for the code please redirect them to the office.

We will also be tightening up our front door policy by keeping it locked more often, particularly when Religious School is in session. This will require congregants and visitors to be buzzed in. We feel this is necessary and preferable to leaving the front doors unlocked and/or unattended.

During busy times, we will leave the front doors open for easy entrance. When children are coming in for Religious School the doors will be open for 15 mins after the scheduled start time, but will then be locked until 10 mins before dismissal. For your child's safety please come into the building to pick up your children. Students will not be dismissed to the parking lot without an adult.

We regret any inconvenience this may cause you, but we feel this is in the best interest of keeping our children and congregants safe.

From Our President:

Dear Congregants,

2015 is behind us and we are ushering in 2016. Our school year started off a little shaky with the resignation of our Education Director. We have a committee reviewing our requirements for the position and attempting to understand what had been working and not working with our prior Education Directors.

Andrea Finestrauss has stepped into the position on an interim basis and has brought stability to our educational program. Classes and activities are running smoothly and we may continue with this arrangement for the educational director's position for the balance of the school year.

Security has been an issue that has been on the Administrations mind for some time. Over the course of the coming year we will be making improvements and upgrading security within Temple Beth El. A significant step will be the replacement of our doors which we are planning to do in conjunction with a Grant we expect to be awarded this year. The new doors will offer a higher level of security than our current doors. We will also be reviewing administrative procedures and upgrade the lock on our Kitchen door. These are just some of the steps being taken to make TBE a safer place. Please be patient and understanding through this process.

I am forming a nominating committee for the opening positions for the Board of Directors for the Temple for the upcoming year 2016-2017. According to our constitution this committee shall be made up of 2 Board members and 3 non-Board congregants. This is the official notice of this committee and if any congregants wish to serve on the nominating committee please contact me no later than January 22, 2016.

We have entered the initial year of Rabbi Micah's new contract and as part of the contract we have a review committee that is headed by Rich Squadron. Also serving on the committee are Arnie Caine and Marilyn Denn. The committee has been meeting with the Rabbi on a regular basis with the goal of improving our governance, communication and the overall management of the Temple. Feel free to contact any of the committee members with any comments or input.

We have several great activities upcoming. The Men's Club is organizing Jewish Heritage Night which is an event in conjunction with the 76'rs basketball game January 23rd. Contact Stu Widom or the Temple office.
