FROM THE RABBI

It was so nice to see so many of you at BMH-BJ on Rosh Hashana. The presence of various minyanim and the diverse activities and learning over the two days filled our shul with an energy that was palpable. We hope you were inspired and uplifted by what you experienced. We will offer similar opportunities for Kol Nidrei and Yom Kippur and hope you will be with us.

I spoke on the first day about overcoming what is called the "better than average" mindset that prevents us from honestly assessing the traits and behaviors that need improvement. I also suggested that we should "think small" as we endeavor to make the necessary changes and that the goal should be consistency and constancy in our behavior. On day two, I spoke about developing a predisposition to forgive those who may have hurt us, especially when accompanied by a sincere and heartfelt apology.

Over the next week or so, many of us will try to muster the courage to truly apologize to others for hurt we inflicted. There are effective ways to say I am sorry...and there are inadequate ways to say I am sorry. To help us navigate the difference, here are some tips, from Molly Howes, PhD, writing in Psychology Today. Click HERE to read what she has to say.




