Rabbinical Corner



The Jewish People are the world's greatest story tellers, and the stories of Purim and Pesach have long had a hold on our imaginations and our psyches. We cringe as Haman hatches his dastardly plan to destroy us. We smile when the sleepless King just happens to see Haman who is promptly enlisted to repay that debt on behalf of the King. We cheer that Esther speaks up for the Jewish citizens of the Persian Empire and points a finger at Haman who is promptly sentenced to death for insurrection against the openly Jewish Queen.

Similarly, we retell the master story of Pesach every year at the seder, a long and highly ritualized event where we delve deeper and deeper into the significance of every aspect of the plot and seeing the long arm of history (hiSTORY) emerging from every detail. We do our utmost to make the story as unforgettable as possible.

It is fascinating to realize that the command to tell the story of our Egyptian servitude and ultimate liberation was given even before the slaves were free, and before they left Egypt. They were all asked to think about their experiences and, in the moment, in real time, compose the story that would be told to the next generation...and the next after that.

It has now been two years that we have been consumed with COVID and its variants, Delta and Omicron. Who would have thought that two years in, we would still be masking, still social distancing, still worried about where we should go and who we should see? Admittedly, we have relaxed somewhat in these areas, but we are all still anxious because, against our hopes and prayers, it is still here. This will be the third Purim and Pesach that will call on us to celebrate but in a somewhat modified way.

What Purim and Pesach stories will we tell this year? Here is a suggestion. Considering that Purim and Pesach are, at their core, stories about our identity, our faith commitments, and our loyalty to community, it would behoove us to ponder how we have come together and grown as a community. We should realize that at least some of that coming together and growth was the result of COVID. I don't think it's too early to label it a kind of silver lining of all we have experienced these past two years. The key is to keep intensifying our sense of community, in ways small and large, so that it continues long after COVID has been defeated.

Now that would be a story truly worth telling for many years to come!

Cantor's Corner

Tu b'shvat is only a few days away and it is 60 degrees in January. Our new normal continues to surprise. There is so much we have to contend with in our lives these days and sometimes it seems the only thing that is close to the same is being in shul on Shabbat and weekday minyan. We still sing the same songs, wrap our tefillin and hope that our prayers are answered. We pray for health for ourselves and our loved ones. We pray that God will help us wind our way through this new normal.

This will be our third Pesach-Passover during the COVID pandemic in which we haven't been able to hold a normal seder with our friends and loved ones. Just when I start to feel bad for myself, I think of my good friend Jack Goldman who described to me what Pesach was like in Auschwitz where he survived four years until his liberation in 1945. He told me they were able to sneak matzah in one year and everyone who could remember some part of the haggadah would chime in during their secret seders. I am not comparing Covid 19 or any kind of physical illness to the horror of the Shoah but I am saying that we Jewish people somehow manage to find a way to recreate our exodus from Egypt which was the genesis of our people. I'll never forget the difficult challenge of doing a full seder in our home during the first year of COVID. I remember the maror or bitter herbs invoking more tears than in previous years. This year will also be my first Pesach with both of my parents gone; my mom having passed away this past July. So many of my wonderful holiday memories are at my mother's table with way too many guests but always enough room. Maybe this year we will be able to welcome guests into our homes but I think it will still feel very different.

I believe this past year we have connected with our friends in a very deep way. Whether it was the fires in Boulder County where two friends crashed at our house that night or the much smaller than usual gatherings at our home for Shabbat. We have also seen many of our friends through grief, loss and illness not related to COVID. I think I have a much deeper appreciation for the importance of friendship, love and sharing.

Even in times of hardship we can and should celebrate the simchas in our life. Our son Jacob recently became engaged B'H and will be married in February of 2023. Most of you know how much I love kids and hopefully I won't have to be jealous of my friends with grandchildren. May we all see a time of health and happiness in the near future.

Bat Mitzvah of Mia Chaya Noy


