Rabbinical Reflection



James Dyson will forever be associated with high-end beautifully crafted vacuum cleaners, blow dryers, fans and heaters. He portrays himself as an "accidental" designer. Did you know that it took 5,127 prototypes to finally produce the vacuum cleaner that put him on the map? He considers those prototypes examples of "failing well." They were necessary steps on the path to perfecting his product. He learned from each failed prototype and improved accordingly.

Our Torah readings during the months of June and part of July come from the Book of Bamidbar. This fourth book of the Torah describes many of the adventures of the Israelites as they made their way towards the Promise Land. There are more than a few misadventures, as well. Two of the Torah portions describe strikingly colossal failures. In Shelach, corporate Israel missteps in the episode of the *meraglim*, the ill-fated scouting expedition that derailed our entry into the Promised Land for almost four decades. The toll was a heavy one in many ways and disrupted the feelings the people had for Israel, for God, for Moses and for Aaron. In Korach, an individual who felt slighted because he was passed over for important positions, mounted an insurrection that threatened the unity of Israelites, slighted the laws of the Torah and again lowered Moses' position in the eyes of many.

The summer fast days of Tammuz 17 and Tisha B'Av commemorate colossal failings – spiritual, moral, political, individual and communal - on the part of the Jews living in Israel in two different periods. We were sentenced to exile from Israel and then we witnessed the destruction of our Holy Temple twice as a result of these failings.

Did we just fail miserably back then or can we somehow say we may have failed, but we failed well because we have learned from and built upon those mistakes as part of our efforts to do better and better?

This is the challenge – do we see these events simply as mistakes that we are saddled with forever, or do we see them as opportunities to grow and improve and do all in our power to regain the opportunities that still elude us.

The answer depends on all of us. Let us use at least some of the summer for serious reflection and personal growth. May our summer not only refresh, but also renew us.

Thank You!

Mount Nebo extends its appreciation to two extraordinary volunteers: Myra Bender for her work in reconciling cemetery records and files, and to Bonnie Rice for her creative work with our brochures and publications. Another key behind-the-scenes star is our wonderful bookkeeper, Nora Jamieson (who is also the bookkeeper for BMH-BJ) and is truly one of our key team members that keeps Mount Nebo moving forward.

Summer Preparations

Mount Nebo's grounds crews are transitioning from winter shop work to spring/summer ground work to keep Mount Nebo a truly beautiful memorial park to visit. Planning consists of possible water restrictions by the City of Aurora. To help mitigate this situation, we have been updating our sprinkler systems, using more drought resistant grass types and updating controls and piping (the grounds have several miles of buried piping and conduit) to increase watering efficiency. This work, plus the other infrastructure work (roads, fences, pump house, lighting, security, etc.), are all intended to make Mount Nebo a benchmark of modern cemetery operations. Summer also means three of the busiest visitor days: Mother's Day, Memorial Day and Father's Day. We encourage visitors to contact our Administrator with any concerns, items needing attention, questions or comments. We value your feedback and input!

Planning An Unveiling

Many families like to plan an unveiling of new headstones, monuments or engravings as part of the remembrance and loss of a loved one's closure process. Summer and fall are the most popular times for unveilings. Mount Nebo can assist with the process and strongly encourages families to schedule the unveiling event well in advance once you have confirmed completion of the monument process with your supplier. Advance scheduling helps us to accommodate all events on the grounds with the proper preparation. Mount Nebo can provide a cover, rock buckets, chairs, tent and even a microphone to help enhance the experience. To help with expenses, a donation to Mount Nebo is requested for setting up an unveiling.

With *Abortion 2023: A Collision of Medicine, Politics, and Religion* and *Israel's Brilliant First 75 years - Trouble in the Family: Israel and the American Jew*, Dr. Melmed tackled tough and controversial topics that are currently plaguing society.

Valley Beit Midrash

Tov! — What I’ve Learned About Jewish Ethics By Studying The Good Place

June 1 @ 12:00 pm - 1:00 pm

Tov! is a nuanced exploration of *teshuvah* through the recent television show "The Good Place" where characters work to keep one person from being expelled to the "bad place." Over four seasons, the show explicitly teaches concepts in ethical philosophy and portrays their application to moral self-improvement. There is almost no specific religious reference beyond the gestures to "heaven" and "hell." What has intrigued Jewish educators are moves that seem like *midrashim* on *teshuvah* in a Maimonidean sense, some say relating to core Jewish ethical concepts. The Tov! podcast began with the idea of juxtaposing each episode's theme against a Jewish teaching — then dove into *teshuvah* and the moral significance of things like time, friendship and theology. A modern take on a timeless exploration.

George Washington’s Vine and Fig Tree: Micah 4:4 and the Religious Character of the American Republic

July 6 @ 12:00 pm - 1:00 pm

As anyone who has seen Hamilton knows, George Washington loved to quote the prophet Micah’s vision of humankind, each sitting under their own vine and fig tree. Exploring this prophetic phrase within a colonial and American revolutionary context, we will consider how Washington’s adept use of Micah’s image served a larger purpose of forging the religious character of the early American Republic. Special consideration will be given to Washington’s celebrated letter to the Jewish community in Newport, Rhode Island, and to that letter’s place within a broader correspondence with diverse religious communities at the moment of Washington’s first inauguration.

Transcendental Judaism—Hearing the “still small voice.”

August 24 @ 12:00 pm - 1:00 pm

Jewish spirituality is about making a palpable connection with God. Judaism teaches that we connect with God by performing the commandments, the *mitzvot*. Our tradition also teaches that we interpret Torah and the *mitzvot* at multiple levels. The focus of this class is on the mystical level called *sod*. Connecting at this level may be more accessible to a wide range of Jews who might view themselves as “spiritual, but not religious.”

At various times of history, Jews have connected spiritually in a number of ways. The next era may become characterized as transcendental Judaism. Through the meditative quieting of the mind, we can directly experience the “still small voice” that Elijah sensed on that mountaintop.

Midrasha/Confirmation

Leni Cooper, this year's confirmand, presented a beautiful dvar Torah on Shabbat Achrei Mot-Kedoshim, April 29, 2023. Below are some of her remarks.

I was very lucky to be able to meet one-on-one with Rabbi Chaitovsky since January. We talked about why there are so many versions of Haggadot and why so many people do their seder differently. We discussed many things, including all the Fours of the Haggadah – four questions, four children, four different versions of the story - but the topic that really stuck with me was the idea of story-telling.

In Judaism, it is important to continue retelling stories of our past and teach them to the next generation. The tale of Pesach - our escape from Ancient Egyptian enslavement to become a people against all odds – is important.

There is a line in the *Vehi Sheamda* that says "*bechol dor vador omdim aleynu le-chalotaynu* - in every generation there have been those who have sought to destroy us". It's imperative that we continue to talk about anti-Semitic events in our history, such as the Jewish - Roman wars, the Spanish Inquisition, the religious oppression of the Soviet Union and Russia, and the Holocaust. It is paramount that we continue to share our history of overcoming adversity and celebrate our future.

But what if we don't know how to tell a story? One of the coolest things I learned about the Haggadah is that it is a guide for telling the story of Passover. It has been used that way for thousands of years. The Haggadah teaches us how to have a seder and how to share the story.

One of the most important tools for telling the story is the matzah. It gets crumbs everywhere and it tastes like cardboard, but it is the symbol of both freedom and a symbol of slavery. When we break the matzah at the part of the seder called "yachatz", the two pieces are supposed to be different sizes. The Rabbi and I discussed how the smaller piece of matzah represents the things that I already know about myself. The larger piece represents things that I have yet to learn. I'm newly 16 and I am committed to continuing my Jewish and personal journeys of growth.
