## Rabbinical Corner



I have always loved Chanukah. It's thrilling story of the small and outnumbered Maccabee force winning the war against those intent on destroying it remains inspirational. We eagerly embrace the beautiful ritual of lighting the chanukiah and the recitation of Hallel, along with eating latkes and playing dreidel games. As we head into the Winter season, Chanukah also provides a respite from the darkness that seems more pervasive at this time of the year.

It is clear to me that we need the light of Chanukah more than ever. Jews are being subjected to endless antisemitic attacks in a way unprecedented in history. Superstars like Kyrie Erving and Kanye West with tens of millions of followers on social media platforms disseminate vicious lies, discredited tropes and conjured half-truths that are wearying and withering to us.

David Suissa, Editor in Chief at Tribe Media and publisher of the Jewish Journal, wonders in a recent editorial wrote why their accusations focus on supposed Jewish power - Jews control the media, the record labels, the movie studios and sports teams - and overlook a whole other view of Jewish power, one that has little to do with material wealth and everything to do with Jewish wisdom and universal values.

*When Judaism teaches, "What is hateful to you, do not do to your neighbor" and that all of God's children are "created in the image of God," there is a special ethical power in those ideas, the kind of power that moves our hearts.*

*When Jews helped establish some of our most important civil rights organizations, including the NAACP, the Leadership Conference on Civil and Human Rights and the Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee (SNCC), that also was Jewish power.*

*When, between 1910 and 1940, more than 2,000 primary and secondary schools and 20 Black colleges were established in whole or in part by Jewish philanthropist Julius Rosenwald, that also was Jewish power.*

*When Jews made up half of the young people who participated in the Mississippi Freedom Summer in 1964, and Jewish leaders were arrested with Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. after a challenge to racial segregation, that was also Jewish power.*

*It saddens me that this humanistic view of "Jewish power" gets totally lost in the modern media circus when power is measured in dollars and clicks, rather than values and wisdom.*

Kyrie Erving and Kanye West both say they want to share their "light" with the world and seek a higher level of understanding. They can start by learning more about a deeper power that is anything but sinister—the one rooted in the universal wisdom of the Jewish tradition.

Perhaps someone should invite them to celebrate the original Festival of Light, Chanukah.

May the truly bright light of Judaism and Jewish values continue to influence the hearts and minds of people everywhere. Amen!

## Cantor's Corner:

As I sit down to write this article, it is "Mar Cheshvan - bitter Cheshvan," called so because there are no Jewish holidays or even fast days to observe. I've always felt that this somehow takes away from the four or even five Shabbatot that we celebrate and protect during the month of Cheshvan. What do I mean by that? We are told in the Torah "Shamor V'Zachor et Yom Ha-Shabbat," that we should "Guard and Remember with reverence the Sabbath Day." The dual commandment almost seems superfluous. If you are already guarding Shabbat, then why do you need to remember it?

Herein lies a great truth about the Jewish people. My father of blessed memory, first spoke Yiddish until he was about 3 years old. His parents both immigrants from Europe around 1912, were respectively from Romania and Lithuania (yes "Litvak") and did not speak each other's language. As most Jews from Eastern Europe for almost 1,000 years, they both could read and write in Yiddish, written with Hebrew letters. Over the years, my dad read many of the great Yiddish authors and philosophers in their original form. As we spent almost every Shabbos of our lives in Shul, I asked him one day, "Hey Dad, why is Shabbos such a big deal?" He told me and I'll never forget, that one of the greatest of the Yiddish writers was known as "The Achad Ha-Am - The one of the Nation." Interesting name no doubt! He said, "It is not the Jewish people who keep Shabbat but rather, The Shabbat that has kept the Jewish people alive!"

I thought about it, even as a 13 year-old boy and understood what he meant. Because we have had Shabbat to keep us connected to each other and also set us apart in a way from the rest of the world, we are still here after 3,500 years. It's one thing to guard something, it's another to use it. I used to love when The Queen would break out crazy crowns and other bejeweled objects. I love the Pomp and Circumstance. But also that these things were not just relics but were significant and alive. That is our job, to keep Shabbat and Judaism a living and breathing thing, something that sustains and nourishes us.

Alright then, SEE YOU IN SHUL!!!!

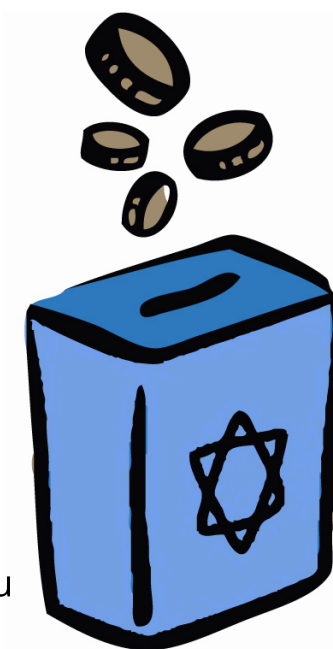
