Rabbinical Corner:



Our tradition teaches "hakol talui be-mazal – everything depends on luck." However, we choose to understand that statement as there is much in life that does depend on luck. The coronavirus and Chanukah are examples of this.

In 1918, the Spanish Flu affected one third of the world, killing 50 million people. It was the worst pandemic ever. Did you know that? The fact is, very little was written about the Spanish Flu and the havoc it brought to the world. Historian Alfred Crosby writes in his book, *America's Forgotten Pandemic*, "the average college graduate born since 1918 knows more about the Black Death of the 14th century than about the World War I pandemic." Why is that? The answer might be that the virus had no *mazal*. It was overshadowed by the conclusion of the War and everything connected to that.

Chanukah, on the other hand, lucked out. Truth be told, Chanukah had a hard time "making it" onto the national Jewish calendar. It was argued that Judaism does not glorify military victories. Moreover, after the Maccabee victory of 165 BCE, there were years of internal strife and civil unrest that ultimately led to the Temple's destruction. The Mishna contains scant mention of the holiday and the Gemara features only one detailed discussion of its rituals and history.

But Chanukah lives on to this day. It is one of the most widely observed festivals of the year, even though it is considered a relatively minor holiday. It lucked out. Its proximity to that other December celebration – with all of that one's good cheer and gift giving – was lucky for Chanukah. When you think of it, the spinning *dreidel* is the perfect symbol for Chanukah. Dreidel is a game of luck. Chanukah is lucky.

Of course, it was Hillel who offered the idea that there was religious and spiritual significance to Chanukah and urging us to add an additional light for each day of the festival. Shammai had argued, more practically, that we should delete a light each night, reflecting the depleting oil supply. Hillel's opinion held sway – perhaps another lucky factor for the *chag*.

What will happen to our pandemic? Will our grandchildren and great grandchildren learn about it? Will they talk about it? It might depend on luck. I hope that Chanukah will always remind us of how lucky we are to be part of the Jewish people.

Cantor's Corner:

Life looks very different than it did two years ago. Masks, social distancing, horrible air travel, shortages of everything, Zoom instead of in person, OY VEY!! Can we even remember what it was like before Covid?

HOLD ON, there are a few things that have not changed: Love, caring, community and prayer. We here at the BMH-BJ are praying, sharing and caring every day. Shabbat services are better than ever and there are enough people, singing, *davening* and taking care of each other emotionally. The Jewish people are a resilient and forward-thinking group.



There are two great Yiddish words that sum up this past year: "Tzurus and Oy Vey -Troubles and What am I going to do!!" Both of these expressions are actually ancient Hebrew phrases. Tzarot are things that give you a pain in the neck that rubbing doesn't help. Nagging issues that keep you up at night. Maybe even the state of the world currently, as in "We've got Tzurus!" Then there's the well known outside of the Jewish world "Oy Vey," as in I burned the sweet and sour meatballs, "Oy Vey, what do I do now!!" It's often our immediate response when we hear dire news, like there's been another school shooting, God forbid. In fact, the origin of "Oy Vey" comes right from the Torah. Our enemies are called "Oy-V'eye" those that are bent on destruction and mayhem, sometimes for no apparent reason.

The antidote to all this is community. We need you. We need your physical presence and what you can only provide with your voices and hands. We all need to call someone and ask how they're feeling. It is amazing what a simple phone call can do for someone, especially if they are isolated and alone because of Covid-19 or just where they are in their life. We used to live in neighborhoods where someone would notice we've not been around. One place like that is shul, people notice when you're not around for a while. People smile when you show up. It feels, pre-Covid, like prehistoric!!

I made a call recently to someone who had been in the hospital for a couple of days. I heard they had come home and it took literally 5 minutes to brighten their day. Their first question was, "How did you know?!" I said, "A little bird told me (Ilene!!)." Then they softened and said, "Thank you so much, you changed my day." I believe we all need to step off the technology wheel once in awhile and simply pick up the phone, come to a morning Minyan or Shabbat service and share some Kugel at Kiddush.

Many great things happening this winter including a wonderful winter concert featuring Rabbi Joe Black and myself with a great band. This is another way to bring together the Denver Jewish Community. Not through tragedy but with Music and Fun. By showing up as a community we can support each other in ways that really matter, no matter what else is going on.

Pioneer Jewish History of Leadville

Wednesday, January 5, 2022 at 7pm at BMH-BJ

Please join us for a fascinating evening with Bill Korn, President of the Temple Israel Leadville Foundation, as he discusses Leadville's little-known Jewish history. Learn about Temple Israel, the historic Leadville Hebrew Cemetery and the colorful Jewish community of the late 1800s, who not only lived, but thrived at two-miles high.

Bill will share stories of Leadville notables, including David May of department store fame, members of the Guggenheim family and one-time Denver Mayor Wolfe Londoner. Hear about the rise (and decline) of the Jewish presence in Leadville, the businesses the local Jews once owned, as well as the amazing story of the rehabilitation of the neglected cemetery and the reconstruction of the abandoned temple as it became a museum.

Though there is no longer an active Jewish congregation or clergy serving Leadville, Temple Israel was a busy Reform temple one hundred years ago; one of two Jewish congregations in Lake County. The other congregation, the Orthodox Kneseth Israel, had a far smaller footprint in Leadville. The building that once housed that shul became a church and was torn down in 1937. Today it is a parking lot.

The Temple Israel Museum and the Historic Leadville Hebrew Cemetery are managed by the Temple Israel Leadville Foundation. The cemetery is always open and free to visit. The museum is also always free to visit. It is open and staffed seven days a week from mid-May through the end of October. November through early May the museum is open by appointment only.

Bill Korn is a native of New York and long-time Colorado resident. He received his bachelor's degree at the University of Michigan and his MBA at the University of Colorado-Boulder. Bill is married and the father of adult twin daughters.






