

Parashah Summary The *Sidrah* begins with the arrival of three strangers at Abraham's tent with messages from G-d. He is told that a son will be born to his wife Sarah and that soon Sodom and Gomorrah will be destroyed as punishment for its people's evil ways. Abraham pleads with G-d not to destroy the people and G-d assures him that if ten worthwhile people can be found in the cities that they will not be destroyed. However, no worthwhile people are found and only Abraham's nephew, Lot, and his family escape the destruction. Isaac is born and as he grows up Sarah requests that Abraham send Hagar and Ishmael away in order to protect Isaac from bad influence. Abraham faces the ultimate challenge when G-d asks him to sacrifice Isaac. As he is about to carry out G-d's will G-d informs him that it was only a test, He does not desire human sacrifice.

In Today's Haftarah The Haftarah tells of an incident in the life of an early Prophet, Elisha, who lived in the ninth century B.C.E. Like Abraham the heroic figure in the Sidrah, Elisha, too, performs great acts of kindness to humans. During his wonderings in Israel, Elisha is approached by a poor widow whose two children may be taken from her to become slaves because she is unable to pay her debts. Elisha has great pity for the woman and her young children. He performs a miracle, providing her with a good supply of oil. She sells the oil and pays off her creditors. Her children are saved. In his further wanderings, Elisha is given shelter in the house of a woman in the town of Shuneem. This story also recalls the story of Sarah. The woman welcomes Elisha and his servant, Gehazi, and they are grateful to her for her hospitality. In return, Elisha informs the woman that she and her husband will be blessed with a child. The child is born, but several years later suffers a sunstroke. She brings the child to Elisha, and the Prophet applies mouth-to-mouth resuscitation and the child is saved.
