Parashat Vayeilech (Vayeilech — Devarim/Deuteronomy 31; pg 1094)

In the *sidrah*, Joshua is appointed to be Moshe's successor as leader of Israel. Moses assures the people that they have no need to be afraid. G-d will be with them and He will guide Joshua as He had guided Moses. To be strong and of good courage is the instruction which Moses gives to Joshua. Moses completes the writing of the Torah and he entrusts it to the *Kohanim* and the Elders of Israel. He instructs them to read the Torah before the people at regular intervals; the Torah was not to remain the specialty of the Kohanim/Priests but was to be heard and to become familiar to all of the people.

In Today's Haftarah (Hosea 14:2-10; Joel 2:11-27; Micah 7:18-20; pg 1204)

This week's *haftarah* is made up of selections from the writings of three Prophets: Hosea, Micah and Joel. It is always assigned for reading on the Shabbat of Repentance (Shabbat Shuvah), which occurs between Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur. The theme which is common to the three readings is the theme of repentance.

Hosea 16.2-20

Hosea pleads with the people in the northern Kingdom to change their ways and return to G-d. If they return, G-d will forgive them and they will live in their land in peace amid plenty. G-d's love and mercy are without end. There is always hope for those who repent.

Micah 7.18-20

Micah was the prophet who pleaded for the poor. He criticized the society which lived in luxury and at the expense of the suffering poor and underprivileged among them. Micah assures the people that G-d forgives and is merciful to those who turn from wrongdoing.

Joel 2.15-27

Joel speaks to his people of the destruction which threatens them. They must hold back from rejoicing and repent with sincerity. Let the *shofar* be blown and let the people be brought together, that they may be sanctified again.
