Parashah Summary

The *Sidra* tells of the birth of twins boys to Isaac and Rebekah. The first-born is Esau, the second is Jacob. As they grow it becomes clear that the brothers have completely different personalities. Esau becomes the roving hunter, always out for the kill. Jacob is the gentle one, a peaceful shepherd. Isaac loved Esau and Rebekah favored Jacob.

According to the custom of the day, the first-born Esau was entitled to receive a double share of the family inheritance. In addition, Hebrew tradition passes on the responsibility of continuing the family's religious traditions as spiritual head of the clan. Esau was not well qualified to carry out this religious responsibility and sensing this Jacob manages to get Esau to sell his birthright to him for a bowl of lentil soup. Years pass, and Isaac, the father, grows old and blind. He feels that death may be coming and he decides to make known his last will and testament. In keeping with the birthright tradition, he automatically assumes that Esau will be his spiritual heir, and does not know that Esau has already sold it for soup years ago. Isaac invites Esau to prepare to receive his blessing, however, Rebekah, overhearing this, decides to act against Isaac's wishes and convinces Jacob to deceive the almost blind Isaac. Rebekah knew that Jacob was the more worthy to carry on the spiritual tradition of his fathers.

Jacob comes to his father in Esau's place and is given the blessings of the birthright. When Esau arrives for the blessing the deceit is reveled. "Bless me also my father, " pleads the disappointed Esau, and Isaac tells him "You shall serve your brother, but the time will come when you will shake of the yoke of this service." Esau is not satisfied and before he can take revenge, Rebekah sends Jacob away to hide in far-off Mesopotamia.

In Today's Haftarah

In the *Haftarah*, Malachi especially criticizes the Priests who are in charge of the Temple. They have not been good religious leaders among the people. They are not serious about their responsibility. Sacrifice of animals is not all that G-d asks of His People. They must uphold truth and righteousness. This is the real purpose for which Jacob and his descendants have been chosen by God over Esau and those that came after him. The Priests must remember this and they must lead the people back to God and an ethical life.

Have we not all one Father?

Hath not one God created us?

Why do we deal treacherously every man against his brother...?
