The *Sidrah* tells of the birth of twins to Isaac and Rebecca. The eldest, Esau, becomes a roving hunter, always out for the kill. The younger, Jacob, is gentle, peaceful, and Torah loving. Isaac loved Esau and Rebecca favored Jacob. Because he was firstborn, Esau was entitled to the birthright according to the custom of his day, and was also charged with continuing the religious and spiritual traditions of his family. Feeling Esau was unfit for the job, Jacob asks Esau to relinquish his birthright to him for lentil soup, and receives Esau's pledge. Years later when Isaac is blind and nearing the end of his life, he gives over his last will and testament, and unknowingly blesses Jacob in Esau's place.

Gil Troy is a Distinguished Scholar in North American History at McGill University and a Visiting Professor this year at the Ruderman Program in American Jewish Studies at Haifa University. He has written nine books on the American presidency, including his latest, "The Age of Clinton: America in the 1990s." He is also the author of "Why I Am a Zionist, and Moynihan's Moment: America's Fight Against Zionism as Racism." A regular columnist for The Jerusalem Post, the Daily Beast, the Canadian Jewish News and the Jewish Week, he is currently working on an update of Arthur Hertzberg's classic "The Zionist Idea."
