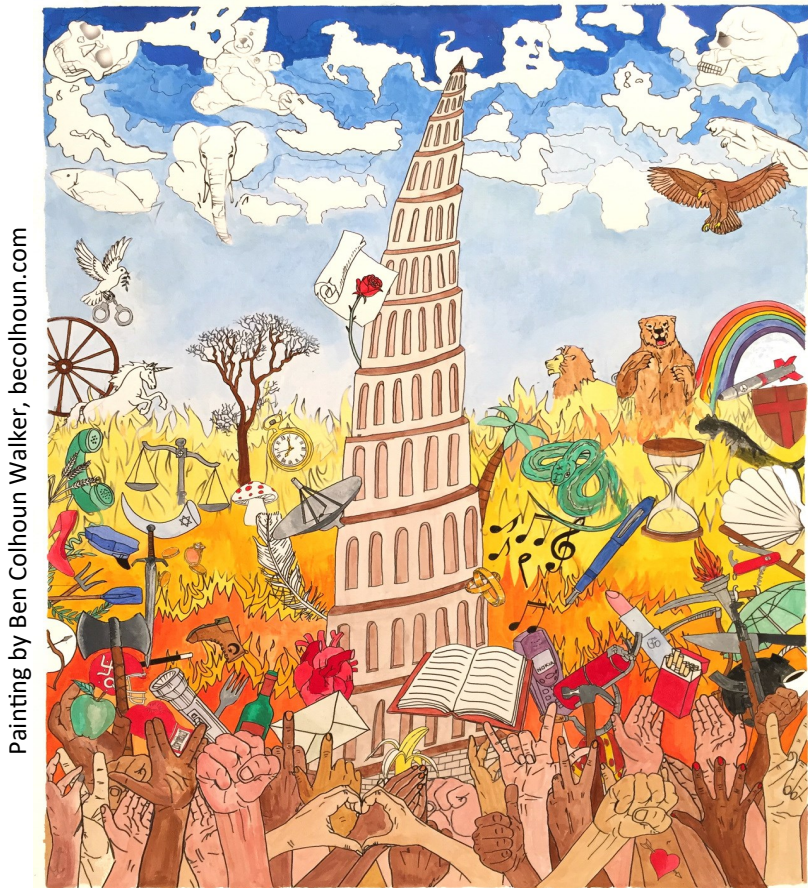

Parashat Noach (Ge. 6:9-11:32; pg 30)

In the *sidrah* G-d instructs Noach—the only righteous man in a world consumed by violence and corruption—to build a large wooden *teivah* (“ark”), coated in and out with pitch. A great deluge, says G-d, will wipe out all life from the face of the earth; but the ark will float upon the water, sheltering Noach and his family, and two members (male and female) of each animal species.

Rain falls for 40 days and nights and the waters churn for 150 days more before calming and beginning to recede. The ark settles on Mount Ararat and from its window Noach dispatches a raven, and then a series of doves, “to see if the waters were abated from the face of the earth.” When the ground dries completely—exactly one solar year (365 days) after the onset of the Flood—G-d commands Noach to exit the *teivah* and repopulate the earth.

Noach builds an altar and offers sacrifices to G-d, who swears never again to destroy all of mankind because of their deeds, and sets the rainbow as a testimony of His new covenant with man. G-d also commands Noach regarding the sacredness of life: murder is deemed a capital offense, and while man is permitted to eat the meat of animals, he is forbidden to eat flesh or blood taken from a living animal.

Noach plants a vineyard and becomes drunk on its produce. Two of Noach’s sons, Shem and Japheth, are blessed for covering up their father’s nakedness, while his third son, Ham, is punished for taking advantage of his debasement.

The descendants of Noach remain a single people with a single language and culture for ten generations. Then they defy their Creator by building a great tower to symbolize their own invincibility; G-d confuses their language so that “one does not comprehend the tongue of the other,” causing them to abandon their project and disperse across the face of the earth, splitting into seventy nations.

In Today’s Haftarah (Isaiah 54:1-10; pg 1131)

The *haftarah* is a message by the Prophet Isaiah to his fellow Jews who had been exiled to Babylonia after the destruction of Jerusalem in 586 B.C.E. Driven from their homeland they despaired and wondered about their future.

But Isaiah compares their exile to the days of the Flood in Noach’s time. Their exile will pave the way for them to start anew. They shall be redeemed and restored by G-d to Zion. Yes, G-d had been angered with Israel for their earlier wrongdoings and they had been driven from their land by the conquerors. But this was not the end of them as His people. Their exile was a punishment. Now, however, having learned their lesson, they would be redeemed by G-d.

For the mountains may depart, and the hills be removed,

But My kindness, shall not depart from you, nor My covenant of peace be removed....
