In this Sidrah Joseph proposes to his brothers that they leave Benjamin in Egypt as a slave in exchange for their own freedom. Brother Judah pleads with Joseph to let him, Judah, stay on in Egypt instead, and allow Benjamin to go back to their father Jacob. Joseph is very much affected by this and realizes that his brothers have regretted what they did to him. Joseph can no longer hold back and identifies himself to his brothers. They are shocked and afraid. What might he do to them now by way of punishment? But, instead, Joseph quickly assures his brothers that he bears them no grudge for in fact he believes that it was the will of G-d that he should come to Egypt before them so he could save them from the famine at this time.

Joseph urges the brothers to go back to Canaan and bring Jacob and all the clan to Egypt. Pharaoh is pleased for Joseph and offers his family the best grazing land available in Goshen to settle. When Jacob comes down there is a joyous reunion between Jacob and Joseph, and all of the family.

Haftarah Summary

The Prophet Ezekiel was among the exiles taken captive by Nebuchadnezzar to Babylonia in 598 B.C.E. Along with some of his Hebrew fellow-exiles, Ezekiel settled in a place called Tel Aviv on the Chebar Canal. It was a difficult period for his people. They were a defeated nation in a foreign land. What hope was there for a return to their homeland? Had G-d rejected them forever? Ezekiel is inspired to renew the people's faith in G-d so that He will bring about their return to Jerusalem. The Prophet Ezekiel promises the exiles in Babylonia a great and wonderful time ahead—when they and the Israelites who had been exiled two centuries earlier (722 B.C.E.) from the Northern Kingdom would be brought back and be reunited as a nation once more. Then the people of the world would see and know that G-d and Israel were at peace once more.

The theme link between the *Sidrah* and the *Haftarah* is that of reunion. Joseph is reunited with the House of Jacob and the future will bring a reunion of all of it's Jewish exiles.
