Parashat Tetzaveh (Ex. 27:20 - 30:10; pg 464)

The *sidrah* tells of procedures that were to be carried out in the *Mishkan*, the portable house of worship in the wilderness. G-d tells Moses to receive from the children of Israel pure olive oil to feed the “everlasting flame” of the seven-branched *menorah*, which Aaron is to kindle each day, “from evening till morning.”

The priestly garments, to be worn by the *kohanim* (priests) while serving in the *Mishkan* are described. All *kohanim* wore: 1) the *ketonet*—a full-length linen tunic; 2) *michnasayim*—linen breeches; 3) *mitznefet*—a linen turban; 4) *avnet*—a long sash wound above the waist.

In addition, the *Kohen Gadol* (high priest) wore: 5) an *efod*—an apron-like garment made of blue, purple and red-dyed wool, linen and gold thread; 6) a *choshen*—a breastplate containing twelve precious stones inscribed with the names of the twelve tribes of Israel; 7) a *me'il*—a cloak of blue wool, with gold bells and decorative pomegranates on its hem; 8) a *tzitz*—a golden plate worn on the forehead, bearing the inscription “Holy to G-d.”

Tetzaveh also includes G-d’s detailed instructions for the seven-day initiation of Aaron and his four sons—Nadav, Avihu, Elazar and Itamar—into the priesthood, and for the making of the golden altar on which the *ketoret* (incense) was burned.

Maftir Zachor (Dt. 25:17-19; pg 1066)

Israel is to remember the treacherous attack of Amalek when they were in the desert. Because Amalek struck the first unprompted blow against the seemingly defenseless children of Israel during their Exodus march from Egypt, the Amalekites should never be forgiven.

In Today’s Haftarah (I Samuel 15:1-34; pg 1214)

The Shabbat before Purim is designated as Shabbat Zachor. An extra portion of the Torah is read, in addition to the *sidrah*. It tells of the brutal attack against Israel by Amalek during their years in the wilderness. In turn, Israel is commanded to remember the treachery of Amalek.

The *haftarah* of Shabbat Zachor deals also with Amalek’s aggression against Israel centuries later during the reign of King Saul. The Prophet Samuel instructs Saul to retaliate for Amalek’s treachery. According to tradition, Haman, who wished to destroy the Jews of Persia, was a descendant of Amalek. Hence, the special readings on the Shabbat before Purim.

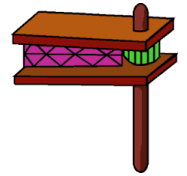
