

Parshah Summary

In the *Parasha*, Korach incites a mutiny challenging Moses' leadership and the granting of the *kehunah* (priesthood) to Aaron. He is accompanied by Moses' inveterate foes, Dathan and Abiram. Joining them are 250 distinguished members of the community who offer the sacrosanct *ketoret* (incense) to prove their worthiness for the priesthood. The earth opens up and swallows the mutineers and a fire consumes the *ketoret*-offerers.

A subsequent plague is stopped by Aaron's offering of *ketoret*. Aaron's staff miraculously blossoms and brings forth almonds, to prove that his designation as high priest is divinely ordained. God commands that a *terumah* ("uplifting") from each crop of grain, wine and oil, as well as all firstborn sheep and cattle, and other specified gifts, be given to the *Kohanim* (priests).

Haftarah Summary

The Haftarah tells the story of Samuel, the last and the greatest of the men known as Shoftim (Judges). There were about twelve Judges who ruled over the Isarealite tribes for several centuries after they entered Canaan, between the time of Joshua and the appointment of Saul as first king of Israel. Samuel proved to be a Prophet and Judge of outstanding character, and he was able to unite the Israelite tribes during the years of his dedicated leadership. When Samuel grew old, the leaders of Israel asked that he appoint a king over them. Samuel tried to dissuade them, but the people were determined. And so Samuel asked God for help in choosing the ruler. God informed Samuel that Saul was the one to be anointed king of Israel.

The Haftarah tells of Saul's coming to the throne and Samuel's farewell address to Israel.
