Parashah Summary

Moses reviews a variety of Laws which are intended to strengthen family life and human decency in Israel. Some of them include: the prohibition of forcefully taking women captured in battle; parents are responsible for the education of their children but are not allowed to punish their children severely without community consent; lost property must be returned to its owner; accident prevention is the obligation of the property owners and that high places must be fenced to prevent people from falling; kindness to animals is required by Law and causing suffering is prohibited; the community is responsible for the needs of strangers, widows, and orphans; the Law requires honest business practices—weights and measures must be absolutely dependable. Moses tells the people that if they follow the Torah's many laws they will be a just and peaceful society.

Haftarah Summary

The Haftarah is from the book of Isaiah. Isaiah brings a message of confidence to his people in the Babylonian exile, a message of faith in the strength of the relationship between G-d and Israel. There is a great "happening" ahead—Israel shall soon be restored to Zion! And when that happens the ancient land and its returned Israel shall no longer be dry and barren. All will be beautifully fruitful. Most important, there will be a great love once more between G-d and His people. There shall be renewed the "Covenant of peace."
