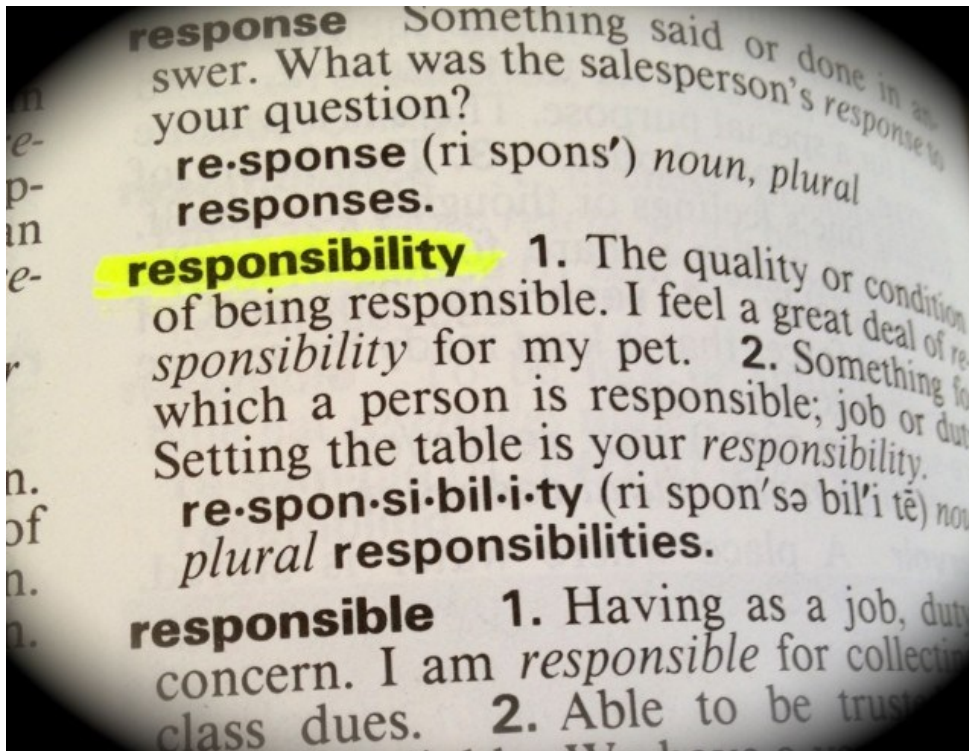

Parashat Re'eh (Re'eh — Devarim/Deuteronomy 11:26-16:17 pg 998)

In the *Sidrah*, Moses continues to address Israel. "See," says Moses, "I set before you this day a blessing and a curse: the blessing if ye shall hearken unto the commandment of the L-rd your G-d, which I command you this day; and the curse if you shall not hearken..." Once they enter the land, the future of Israel will depend on the people choosing to follow the laws which Moses spells out for them. These should be proclaimed on Mount Gerizim and Mount Ebal when the people cross over into the Holy Land. These include abolishing idol-worship, creating a central Sanctuary, guarding against false prophets, keeping the laws of Holiness, Kashrut, the Sabbatical Year, and the Pilgrimage Festivals in Jerusalem, and the giving of tithes to support the *Kohanim*, *Leviim*, and the poor.

In Today's Haftarah (Isaiah 54:11 — 55:5; pg 1199)

In the *Haftarah*, Isaiah talks to the exiles in Babylon/Persia. If the people shall indeed fulfill G-d's high ethical goals, then Zion shall be beautifully transformed and Jerusalem shall become a model city of the world.

The Prophet offers his people a message predicting a wonderful time to come when Israel will be restored to Zion, and it will be a beautiful land with children who bring joy and blessings to their families. Isaiah asks of the exiles a full faith in G-d in return for which they need have no worry about their lives. They will be greatly blessed if they carry out the Covenant between G-d and Israel. The *Sidrah* opens with the choice presented Israel between right and wrong; and the promise of deliverance from oppression if the Israelites follow paths of righteousness.

Special Shabbat morning services, September 7 — mark your calendars

For one week only, we will experiment with a new kind of service in our beautiful sanctuary. Led by Rabbi Chaitovsky and Cantor Goldstein, the service will be song-filled, spirited and uniquely inclusive and participatory. A low, aesthetically pleasing mechitzah will ensure equal sacred space for women and men. It will provide clear and equal sight lines to both the bimah and the cantor's amud. Moreover, it will enable us to honor women with carrying the Torah as it makes its way to and from the ark - an opportunity that no other Denver traditional congregation allows. Mixed seating in front of the cry room will still be available.
