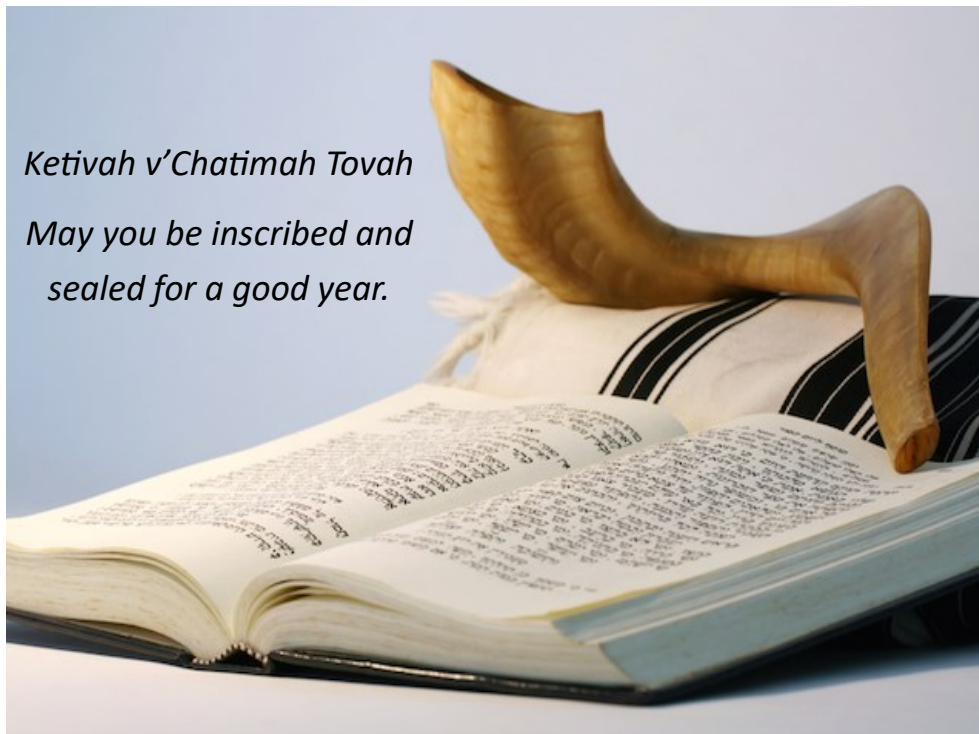

Parashat Nitzavim (Nitzavim — Devarim/Deuteronomy 29:9-30 pg 1086)

In the *sidrah*, Moses points out that all of Israel is gathered together for the completion of their Covenant with G-d. It is a Covenant which is binding upon every one of them; men, women, and children alike. It is binding also upon all of the generations of Israel that will follow, for all time to come. The Torah and its teachings will be theirs as much as if they had personally received it at Sinai. Israel of past, present, and future are bound by the Covenant into an unending continuity.

But Moses, having led Israel for four decades, knows that they are capable of straying from G-d's teachings, and he foretells that they will break from the Covenant in the future. Israel will be tempted to imitate the pagan ways of neighboring nations. Selfishness will mislead others among Israel with the feeling that they can get away with it, but G-d will not overlook Israel's wrongdoing. They shall suffer for this, their land will be destroyed and they will be driven into exile.

However, Israel will sincerely repent the wrongs committed, and G-d will gather them from the lands of their exile, and He will restore them to their land to enjoy the blessings of the Covenant. Israel will discover that G-d's commandments and teachings are within reach of everyone and that they bring meaning to life.

In Today's Haftarah (Isaiah 61:10-63:9; pg 1202)

This week's *haftarah* is from the Book of Isaiah. The Prophet speaks to his fellow exiles in Babylonia and predicts the future glories of Zion. Jerusalem rejoices at the return of her people, Israel. Israel rises up victorious among the nations. Never again will this people be forsaken nor will its land ever be desolate. Jerusalem will be under G-d's protection, for He will set up dependable guardians on her walls. None among the nations will be able to take advantage of Israel again. Let the exiles prepare now for their return to Zion.
