Good erev Shabbat to all! The second part of this week's double Torah reading of Matot-Masei, which concludes the Book of Bamidbar/In The Desert, is essentially the 40 year travel itinerary of the Jewish People as they journeyed to the Land of Israel. By having Moshe mention the "places they visited" by name - the Israelites would be reminded of the events that happened at each specific place. The journey had its ups and down, to be sure. Overall, though it paints a portrait of a resilient, if obstinate, people, who grow slowly but surely to be worthy of entering the long awaited Promised Land.

All of us at BMH-BJ have been on a journey, too. The pandemic has detoured us but has not derailed us. We marked the start of summer by resuming services on site each weekday and each Shabbat.
