November was a short, yet productive month. Our Tuesday Zoom school classes for kitot Daled-Chet/4th-8th grades, have been focusing on the middah/attribute of B'tzelem Elokim/in the image of God. The initial lessons were timely because they revolved around the theme of teshuva/repentance before the High Holidays. These units are divided into weekly lessons, exploring Jewish values, and their purpose is to bring about the best "you" that you can be. The talmidim/students ponder questions presented and are taught critical thinking skills about themselves, others, and the greater good of community. Our Sunday classes serve as a bridge between the Jewish values we learn, and how they connect to all the other subjects we focus on such as the parsha/weekly Torah

portion, chagim/ holidays, Israel,

tefillah/prayer, and how they all interconnect.

We shared a lovely Day of Jewish Learning with our horim/parents. The topic for kitot Gan-Hai/K - 5th grades was: Are we raising our children with the same family dynamic as our ancestors did during Biblical times? We learned the story of Yaakov and Eisav/Jacob and Esau and even though they were twins, they looked completely different in appearance, as well as totally different personalities. And how their parents each treated them differently according to their individual needs. The yeladim/children made puppets and acted out what their relationship is like with their own siblings, and discussed the differences and similarities between themselves. The topic for kitot Zayin-Chet/7-8th grades was Being



a king and being a father; can you do both well? They delved into and discussed King David and his complicated relationship with his children.

Chanukah is around the corner! We are looking forward to sharing our morning on December 10 with the children and their parents, lighting the chanukiah, singing songs, and welcoming **Devorah Landau**, a storyteller of Jewish lore for children of all ages.









Coffee Tour of Brooklyn

Jackie Chan is quoted as saying, "Coffee is a language in itself." On October 15, Rabbi Schoenberg proved that to be true. A group of 20 people from Neve Shalom, joined Rabbi Schoenberg as he showed us the views from DUMBO (Down Under the Manhattan Bridge Overpass), Brooklyn and explained the role it has had in the coffee industry.

We began by enjoying a cup of coffee in one of the many coffee shops in the area. As we sat, enjoying the ambiance, Rabbi Schoenberg gave a history of how the area became the center for coffee roasting. We walked around, enjoying the view of the Manhattan Bridge, the Brooklyn Bridge, and even a distant glimpse of the Williamsburg Bridge.

We ended the day with another cup of coffee and learned more about coffee roasting from baristatrained Rabbi Schoenberg. This coffee shop had beautiful art work. We had the chance to see, touch and smell coffee beans that had not been roasted. Surprisingly, unroasted coffee has no smell.




