From the Bimah

Dear Friends,

The 15th day in the middle of the Hebrew month of Shevat is called, in Hebrew, Tu B'Shevat.

Tu B'Shevat marks the New Year for Trees. While this may strike us as an unusual concept, the day was first established to help determine which fruits would be eligible for tithing throughout the upcoming year.

The Hebrew calendar notes four separate new years! We read about the four distinct new years in the Talmud Tractate Rosh Hashanah:

"There are four days in the year that serve as the New Year, each for a different purpose... The first of Shevat is the New Year for trees; the fruits of a tree that was formed prior to that date belong to the previous tithe year and cannot be tithed together with fruit that was formed after that date; this ruling is from the School of Shammai. But the School of Hillel says: The New Year for trees is on the FIFTEENTH OF SHEVAT [Tu B'Shevat]."

For the new year for trees, Jews follow the ruling of the School of Hillel: the new year for trees is on Tu B'Shevat.

The 15th of Shevat is not an arbitrary date but is predicated on the deep mystical notion that it marks the beginning of the revitalization of tree life in Israel. Tu B'Shevat is the day that the sap begins to rise and the very first stirrings of not yet formed buds begin to be felt. It is nature's first anticipation of the upcoming springtime. After the hibernation of winter, new life begins to awaken.

We, too, look with hope for the beginning of spring. We pray that this year, spring will bring an end to all the illnesses and respiratory diseases that have stalked us for so long. We await warmer weather, a chance to spend more time outdoors, to socialize with family and friends. Tu B'Shevat encourages us: the longer days of spring are not far away, flowers and fruit will soon appear. The cycle of the year will not cease.

We will celebrate Tu B'Shevat! on Monday February 6th. This month, plant a tree, take a walk in the park and eat some fruit, especially from Israel, and have a happy Tu B'Shevat!

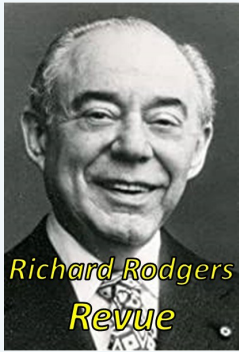
Oklahoma, Pal Joey, Rex, South Pacific, Spring Is Here, State Fair, The Sound of Music, and Two By Two.

Mr. Rodgers worked with Lorenz Hart on 28 musicals and they wrote over 700 songs together. After Mr. Hart's untimely passing, Richard Rodgers collaborated with Oscar Hammerstein II on some of the most successful musicals of the 40s and 50s. Together they won 34 Tony Awards. After Hammerstein's passing, Rodgers wrote other shows with Martin Chaman, Sheldon Harnick, Stephen Sondheim and one where he wrote both the lyrics and music himself. We will certainly include many of the well-known favorites but will also share some pieces which you may not

know so well and a few which are very rare gems.

It might be cold outside, but inside during Religious school, all is comfortable and warm.

Our talmidim/students have been learning about and acting out, quite dramatically, the exciting parshiot/Torah portions of how baby Moshe/Moses was placed lovingly by his mother, Yocheved, into a basket and put into the Nile River to save him from wicked Paroah/Pharoah, while his sister, Miriam watched him floating down the Nile River to make sure he was safe, as well

as the story of the eser makkot/ ten plagues. If you see frogs or grasshoppers jumping about, or hail falling from the sky, know that it's really our yeladim/children role playing!

We had a lovely and meaningful Havdalah service at Color Me Mine in Menlo Park mall. The talmidim painted decorative mezuzah cases into which they will place a klaf/scroll containing the tefillot/prayers of Shema Yisrael written on a small piece of parchment. The Shema is the most important prayer in Judaism because it reminds Jewish people that there is only one G-d. The yeladim already told me their mezuzah will be hung on their bedroom doorpost.

There are several events taking place this month:

- We are looking forward with great anticipation to our Tu B'Shevat Breakfast combined with our third Grandparents Day, the morning of **February 5**. It will be a beautiful sight to see several families with three generations attending!
- On **February 12**, the 6th/7th grade will be joining the World Wide Wrap for Shacharit morning services.
- Students in grades K-5 will be participating through singing the tefillot/prayers during a Friday night Family Service on **February 24 at 5:30**.
- And finally, our 3rd graders will be receiving their first siddur/ Prayer book at their Kabbalat Hasiddur!

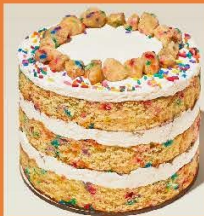
Breakfast "Tree" and Grandparents Day #3

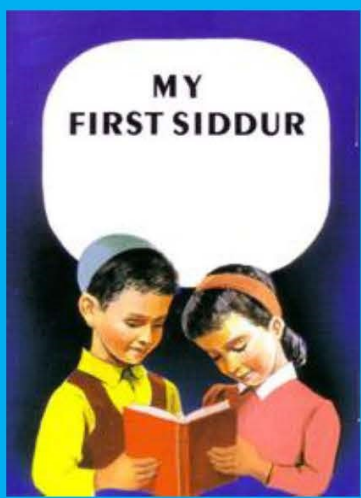

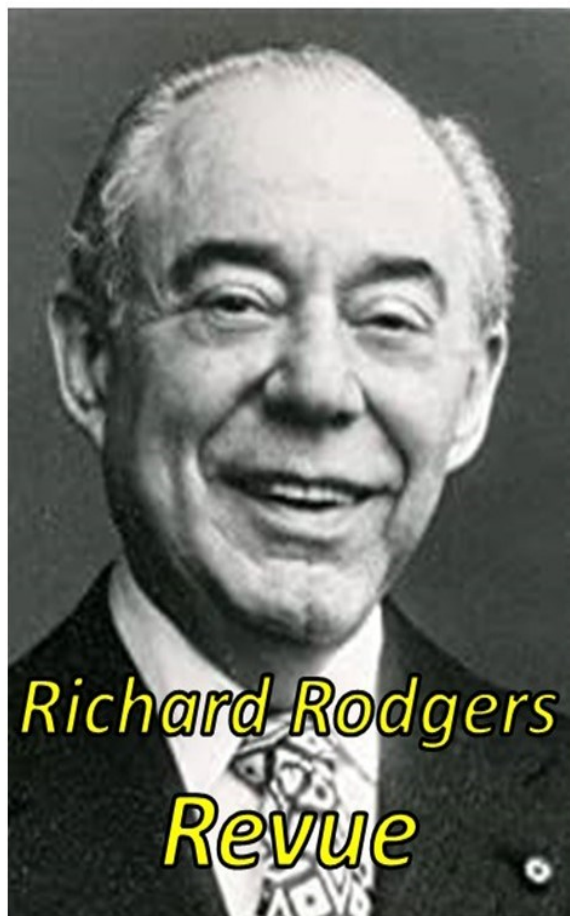
