Dear friends,

urim is a holiday of disguises.

Our rabbis note that the Book of Esther is the only book in the entire Bible that does not mention the name of God. When disaster strikes and Haman threatens to kill the Jews, the community resorts to fasting. There is no recorded communal prayer to Heaven.

Esther, of course, also hides her Jewish identity. When she is first brought into the palace, her uncle Mordechai instructs her to conceal the fact that she is Jewish. It is only when the Jewish people are threatened with a genocide that she reveals her true religion.

Commemorating these disguises, we eat hamantaschen, cookies with hidden filling, and children put on masks and dress in costume, disguising their identities.

But Dr. Eugene Borowitz, a modern theologian, suggests that adult Jews in the US also disquise our identities. Too often, we hide the fact that we are Jewish in order to better fit in with the Christian Americans who surround us. Perhaps worse, sometimes we are ashamed of our Jewish identity, as Christian anti-Semitic tropes permeate society and infect our own psyches. We sometimes accept anti-Semitic stereotypes, Borowitz claims.

And of course, throughout the pandemic we constantly wore masks.

For adults, then, Purim is a time of looking at the masks we might wear every day. How do we hide ourselves? Who do we hide from? Conversely, how can we be more authentic and grounded in our relationships? If we use the holiday of Purim to become more emotionally honest, it truly will be a holiday of "light and joy."

We celebrate Purim Monday night March 6.

Donald & Ruth Kahn Jewish Book and Author Event

Neve Shalom has sponsored the Book and Author Event for over 20 years, featuring interesting and worthwhile books that have a Jewish theme. In our second year of planning this event, Judy Slutzky and I have enjoyed reading many of these numerous books. The three books described below represent those authors we selected who accepted our invitation to present their books at the event, scheduled for the morning of March 26.

This year Book and Author Event will again be virtual because of lingering Covid concerns. Although this means that we lose the social benefits of the in-person event, the virtual event allows us to invite authors beyond the New York area.

The Books

It is difficult not to be curious about a book named <u>Gangsters and Nazis</u>. The author, **Michael Benson** is well known for 60 other books based on the facts of actual murders. I was surprised to learn that in the 1930s large numbers of Germans immigrated to the United States, and certain Germans organized events to explain Nazi party policies, and to invite the audience to join the party. Many of these events occurred in New Jersey. An attorney in New York envisioned that an appropriate response after these outrageous events should not be gentle. He involved **Rabbi Wise** of Cincinnati to present the situation to the gangsters' leaders, explaining that gangsters can rough up the presenters but there must be no deaths.

Ellen Frankel, author of the murder mystery *The Deadly Scrolls* was delighted to be invited back to Neve where she was educated, and to see several old friends including the **Eliot and Barbara Spack** and **Hazzan Levin**. The story follows a woman detective investigating the murder of a researcher who studied Dead Sea scrolls. Her investigation explores places in Israel many Jewish readers will recognize, and several potential events and suspicious characters that we will not.

The third book is <u>A Brilliant Commodity: Diamonds and Jews in a Modern Setting</u>, by Saskia Coenen Snyder, a professor in the history department of the University of South Carolina. As many other locals, I knew about Jews and diamonds in New York and Israel, but had no idea that this labor link began in the nineteenth century. The book begins with skilled factory workers in the industry in the Netherlands, where Professor Snyder is from, and covers many aspects of Jews working in the industry from finding and cutting diamonds, to leading the business.

We have enjoyed planning this annual Neve Shalom event in memory of **Donald and Ruth Kahn**. The program will be Sunday March 26 at 10:00 am on Zoom, using the usual synagogue program links and passwords. You can purchase the books from Amazon or other online book vendors. From 2006 until 2013 he was the lead historian for two galleries of the recently opened POLIN Museum of the History of Polish Jews in Warsaw and works with Yad Vashem in preserving the history of the Warsaw Ghetto. Dr. Kassow has been elected a fellow of the American Academy of Jewish Research.

Professor Kassow's book "Who Will Write Our History" served as the basis for the 2018 film of the same name, which tells the story of the secret archive of the Warsaw Ghetto, created by Emanuel Ringelblum. 




