Dear friends,

Thanksgiving is to me the quintessential American holiday. Few Americans can trace their roots back to the Mayflower. Yet this foundational story of the pilgrims learning from the Native Americans and surviving the challenges of settling in a new land resonates for all. The images of peaceful coexistence between very different peoples give us hope in our fractured times; the reminder that all but the Native Americans are immigrants gives us a common language with those seeking to move here today. It is a holiday that gives us confidence in the promise of America.



Not many Americans realize, however, that the holiday of Thanksgiving was not created out of the blue by the pilgrims. The pilgrims were deeply religious Protestants, and a key Protestant tenant is familiarity with the Bible. The pilgrims read what they called the "Old Testament" as well as the "New Testament." They were familiar with the ancient Jewish holiday of Sukkot celebrating the summer harvest. So, when they were so profoundly relieved as they saw their bountiful harvest, they opened their Bibles. They read about the harvest festival, the holiday of Sukkot. Based on their reading, they planned a special day of Thanksgiving for their good fortune. Our American holiday of Thanksgiving is based on our Jewish holiday of Sukkot!

As we gather around the table this Thanksgiving, let's give an extra thanks for our own, beautiful Jewish traditions, which form the basis of our wonderful American holiday!

May your Thanksgiving be full of an abundance of food, a room full of family and friends and a bounty of positive actions for which you are thankful.

She has vast experience performing with the Israel Defense Forces' performing troop and sings a wide variety of repertoire. Emily Simkin is the

Kita Gan-Bet/Kindergarten-2nd grade read a book explaining on their level what a war is and how many people

around them are feeling at this time. This opened up a beautiful and honest discussion, on an age appropriate level. Our Kitot Deled-chet/ 4th- 8th grades wrote letters to our chayalim/soldiers wishing them hatzlacha/success, and that they should stay safe, and keep Israel secure.

In the beginning...Upon our return to Religious School after Simchat Torah, we opened the Torah and began from the beginning with bereisheet/ Genesis. The talmidim/students are excited to learn about all our Torah has to offer. Observing the classes from year to year, I've seen how the students



critical thinking skills have expanded and grown. Each class learned about how Hashem/God created the world in six days and rested on the seventh. So too, we follow in Hashem's ways. Next, we focused on how the world was evolving, and the story of Noach's Teiva/Noah's Ark. The yeladim/children learned how Hashem saved pairs

of animals (male and female), and Noach's family from the mabul/flood that He brought upon the world. We also discussed Hashem's attributes of rachamim/mercy, compassion, and din/justice, and when each one is necessary. These could be difficult concepts to understand on many levels, yet, each student asked excellent questions and were engaged in class discussions...a pleasure!

Bar Mitzvah Under the Sky in Israel

In September, my grandson, **Bustan Shalom**, became a bar mitzvah in Zichron Yaakov in Israel. Zichron Yaakov, which is north of Tel Aviv and Netanya, was first settled by Jews from Romania in the late 19th century. The farmers planted wheat, which did not grow well. The settlers later received a visit from **Baron Edmond James de Rothschild**, who, in his experience and love of Israel, explained to them that another crop was more suited to Zichron's climate: grapes. The Baron guided them and eventually donated land to the town, some of which became a botanical garden and a nature preserve. He named the town Zichron Yaakov. Zichron means memorial and Yaakov was his father's name.

There are now three thriving commercial wineries in the area, including the well-known Carmel Winery. My grandchildren went to a preschool named "The Gan Next to the Winery." Abba and his friends decided to make wine for the bar mitzvah party. The label read, in Hebrew 'Bar Mitzvah Bustan'

The bar mitzvah was held in the evening in their long, narrow yard across from the nature preserve. There are jackals in the nature preserve, but they did not howl during the service or the party. Chairs were set up by the caterer for the guests.

The Torah arrived shortly before the service, stored in the rabbi's old army duffel bag. The service was no different from what one would have expected at Neve Shalom. In his speech, the rabbi urged Bustan to honor the value of the wisdom of his grandparents (all four were there) and both sisters spoke. Other than that, all was similar to the previous b'nai mitzvah for his two elder sisters.

Many dignitaries were present including Senator Patrick Diegnan, Representative Robert Karabinchak, Edison Mayor Sam Joshi, Metuchen Mayor Jonathon Busch, County Freeholder Charles Tomaro, members of the Edison and Metuchen Town Councils and many members of the Metuchen Edison Interfaith Clergy.

YAHRZEIT OBSERVANCES




