The Meaning Of Yizkor

We recite Yizkor on Yom Kippur. It raises the question... *how do we cope with tragedy?*

Judaism reminds us that we live in a world of polarities, of opposites that can never be resolved. We say in our evening prayers, in a phrase reminding us of the Creation story in Genesis, that G-d rolls away the darkness from before the light and the light from before the darkness. Darkness and light, good and evil, happiness and suffering, one comes and the next follows. The Mishnah describes a rabbi who sees a

wedding party and begins to cry, and then he passes a funeral procession and laughs. His students are perplexed. "Why do you cry at a wedding and laugh at a funeral?" He replies, "Because I know that after the great happiness of a wedding, great sadness will come into that family's life and after the great sadness of the funeral, great joy will come into the other family's life. Tragedy and triumph, hope and despair, is the nature of life on our planet. Pain and sorrow is an inevitable part of every person's life.

Judaism teaches that the challenge of painful times is to remind us that suffering is part of the cycle of life and that the wheel will turn us towards blessing again.

Judaism teaches that suffering is an inevitable part of life, that we can practice an attitude of gratitude for the small miracles of our lives. Though life contains moments of pain and hatred, it also contains moments of joy and celebration. The rabbis remind us to savor life's happy times, to relish our joyful occasions and not merely pass through life with our eyes only on our sorrows. "*VeSamachta beHagecha*" Be happy on the holidays, our Torah commands us. Whether it is a communal holiday such as Sukkot or a private events such as a family birthday, Judaism reminds us to cherish the good times as a precious gift "*VeSamchata beHagecha*" Be happy on the holidays.

At his season of Yizkor, what does this moment come to teach us? How do we cope with tragedy? We remember that all people must suffer; we give thanks for our small miracles, and we cherish the joy in our lives. May we all be inscribed in the Book of Life for good things and many blessings.

Selichot at Neve Shalom

A number of years ago I composed a Selichot service using the prayers of Selichot, based on traditional motifs. However, I arranged each piece in the style of a different Broadway composer. It was very well received and this year **Rabbi Schoenberg** and I will be doing these prayers and tunes on Sunday morning September 10. It is a service but, with the help of pianist **Dave Schlossberg**, it will feel new, creative and contemporary.

These are not parodies. The melodies are based on traditional Selichot prayers and the texts are all from the liturgy. With new harmonies, rhythms and stylings they may sound as if they were composed by **Claude Schoenberg** (*L e s Miz*), **Jason Robert Brown** (*Para de*), **Andrew Lloyd Webber** (Joseph), **Richard Rodgers** (*S o u n d of M u s i c*), **Stephen Sondheim** (*C ompa ny*), and **Marc Shaiman** (*Hairspray*). **Gary William Friedman** who wrote the off-Broadway show, *The Me Nob ody Know s*, composed a

setting of "Shomer Yisrael." We will conclude with "Seasons of Love" from *R e n t* by **Jonathan Larson**.

In the past, we have done Selichot on Saturday nights right after Shabbat. Some shuls do it at midnight. Most Sephardic congregations chant it before dawn. We will be praying this service on Sunday morning, September 10 at 10:00 am.

At 9:00 am there will be the usual morning minyan, at 9:30 am Rabbi Schoenberg will speak about Jews and Broadway and the Selichot service will begin at 10:00 am, followed by refreshments.

I have always found Selichot a moving and special service. It includes some of the themes and a few prayers from the High Holy Days but sung in less than one hour.

There is no charge and we hope you can join us and bring friends and neighbors with you.

I look forward to this next year to be filled with many wonderful services, classes, concerts and special events. Please join us as often as you can.

DONATING BLOOD: What you may not know about this mitzvah



Part of being a member of Neve Shalom is helping the wider community outside our own doors. One way we do this is through our blood drives. We have five a year, approximately every eight weeks - the number of days needed between donations.

Why not donate blood and save lives like **Patrick McAuley** (above, left) and **Daniel Rosenfield**, (bottom, right) have done.

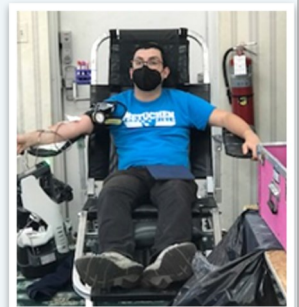
Did you know that every donation saves not one, not two, but three lives? They say every good deed has its reward, and saving lives is a fulfilling reward.

- If you think you are too young or too old to give blood, you might be wrong. You can donate at 16, with written permission from a parent or legal guardian. If you are 17, you can donate without the permission of a parent or legal guardian. On the other side of the spectrum, if you

are 76 years old or older, you might still be able to donate. All you need is a note from your doctor, which will be kept on file. Then, as long as you pass the medical requirements, you can begin saving lives.

- If you thought you were ineligible to donate due to spending time in England, France or Ireland, you may now be eligible. In an effort to combat the blood shortage the FDA has updated their guidelines and is welcoming donors who were previously declined due to the above criteria.

Our next blood drive is September 10. Please consider donating and begin (or continue) to save lives. If you can't make it on September 10, don't worry. We are having another drive on December 3.

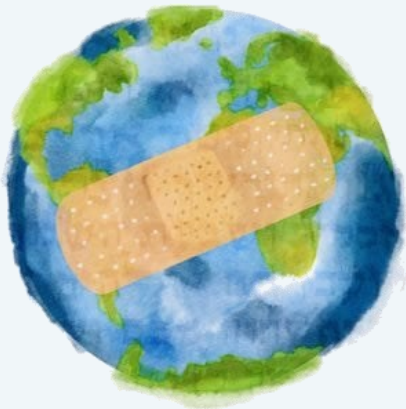

LIFELONG LEARNING

Neve Shalom, Temple Emanu-El and the JCC of Middlesex County will be sharing many of our Adult Education courses and programs this year with classes taught on Zoom or in person. Watch announcements for more details of locations. The complete booklet will be available on Rosh Hashanah. When you register you will receive the appropriate Zoom links.

Neve Shalom members should pay our synagogue; Temple Emanu-El members will pay their Temple. If JCC members do not belong to a synagogue, they should pay the JCC (all will be charging the same fees) and students, at no additional charge, can take any or all classes listed in the booklet. If a person belongs to Neve Shalom and the JCC, **they should pay Neve Shalom**. This was arranged with the other institutions. This year members of the JCC, Temple Emanu-El, or Neve Shalom will pay \$72 per year for as many of the listed classes as you wish to take. We encourage you to register early so we can guarantee that each class will have a sufficient enrollment.

While during the summer we are still working on many details, we know that **Rabbi Schoenberg** will be teaching classes in person on Sunday mornings at 11:00 am and the same material on Zoom the following Thursday morning at

10:00 am. Hazzan Levin, using video clips from Abba Eban's "Civilization and the Jews" series, will cover highlights of 4,000 years of Jewish history in six weeks on Tuesday mornings at 11:30 am. **Rabbi Axe** and **Cantor Simkin** of Temple Emanu-El are planning exciting courses and continuing the Wednesday "Lunch and Learn" sessions. The JCC is presenting a number of creative cultural programs and a Yiddish course with a Borsht Belt theme. Steve Gross continues his Wednesday evening Talmud classes every other week. The outstanding Hayat Speaker series will meet each month on Sundays at Neve Shalom at 10 am. This year's Zelizer Scholar will be **Prof. Dr. David Golinkin** one of the great Halachic experts of the Conservative movement in Israel. There will be the film series in January and many other special concerts, events, programs and trips.
