From the Bimah

It's beginning to look a lot like a pre-pandemic Passover season! Once again, many feel comfortable joining family and friends around the holiday table. Once again we can plan our favorite recipes, or special dishes. Once again, we can greet our dear ones with Passover hugs!

I write this article in the pre-Pesach cleaning days. We turn our kitchens and perhaps our whole houses upside-down to clean the hametz (leavened bread) out of every nook and cranny. I am always surprised by how much dirt accumulates in the corners and amazed by stumbling across a can or bottle I had



forgotten I owned. It is such a big task, we could see why our neighbors in medieval times saw our efforts and concluded that black magic was going on! Of course, we can look at the process as white magic: cleaning out the pantry as symbolically cleaning out the recesses of our souls. It is understandable that the ancient Greeks choose this time of year to mark the death and rebirth of their god Adonis of the Corn. Out with the old and in with the new! We all need what the admen called "the pause that refreshes." The clean kitchen lifts our spirits, and calls forth our gratitude. How wonderful to live in a time of so many conveniences! May we all use the beautiful holiday of Pesach as a time for feeling gratitude, for renewal and rebirth.

But let's not get ahead of ourselves.... aside for all our fantastic, educational in-school learning, the talmidim/students and their horim/parents enjoyed a trip earlier in March to the Jewish Children's Museum in Brooklyn (photos, right). This has been our first trip in the four years since Covid, and it was well worth the trip! There was

so much to actively participate in and explore. Whether it was riding a camel during Biblical times, visiting Abraham and Sarah's tent, climbing through a challah, shopping in an all-kosher grocery store, or experiencing the six days of Creation/*Bereisheet*, there was something for everyone. The *yeladim/*children, even got to make a craft and bring it home as a souvenir.

Next, we had another great experience at the JCC of Edison (see photos on page 4). The annual Purim carnival was a blast with a craft room and lots of fun activities to do. I would personally like to say, todah/ "thank you" and give hakarot hatov/appreciation, to my fellow committee members for their efforts in pulling this carnival together seamlessly.

On Purim day, the Religious School had the opportunity to experience Purim in a most meaningful way. We were able to fulfill the four *mitzvot*/commandments of Purim as a group:

- Lishmoa megillah/hearing the story. We heard the Megillat Esther via a puppet show (compliments of Morah Miriam, aka Snow White)
- 2. Each talmid/student brought in a mishloach manot/gifts of food, to give to their classmates
- 3. Matanote La'evyonim/monetary gifts to the poor. We viewed videos of 2 tzedakah organizations and chose which one should receive a portion of the tzedakah we've collected over the year. The remainder of the tzedakah that we will bring in will go to the other organization at the end of the school year. The tzedakah the children chose was Meir Panim, which means "brighten faces", located in Israel. They provide food and social service programs to children, the elderly, and Holocaust survivors daily.
- 4. We enjoyed a seudah/feast, shared between friends.

We also made hamantaschen from scratch and had a fantastic Purim!

We are looking forward to our Family Model Seder later this month, as well as our annual Mother's Day Tea in May.

Eye on Israel

While Tel Aviv is considered the "New York City" of Israel, there are several peaceful quiet spots amid the hustle and bustle of this fast-paced city. One such place is the neighborhood of Neve Tzedek in southwest Tel Aviv, not far from the beach. Neve Tzedek in Hebrew means "oasis of justice". It was the first neighborhood built outside Jaffa, by a group of Jews who wanted to get away from the overcrowding in that city. One of the founders, a businessman named Aharon Shlush, even built a synagogue to encourage Jews to move to the new neighborhood. Neve Tzedek was established in 1887, over 20 years before the founding of Tel Aviv.

The Jews who moved to Neve Tzedek built their homes in a variety of architectural styles ranging from low rise buildings to the use of a design called Bauhaus. Bauhaus is named after German Jewish architect and was considered modernistic at the time. Israel has the



largest number of Bauhaus designed buildings in the world and several have been named as World Heritage sites by the United Nations. Tel Aviv's first movie theatre, the Eden, which opened in 1913, was built in Neve Tzedek.

By the early 1900's artists and writers made their home in Neve Tzedek. Among them was **Shai Agnon**, a Nobel prize-winning author and the artist, **Nachum Gutman**. **Rabbi Abraham Isaac Kook** was the first rabbi of the community. As Tel Aviv began to develop, the wealthier residents moved northward to new neighborhoods. Neve Tzedek fell into disrepair and in the 1960's Tel Aviv city officials decided to demolish the community. Demolition never happened as several buildings were placed on preservation lists. By the end of the 1980's, the area was being renovated and buildings preserved. Neve Tzedek was reborn as an upscale yuppie neighborhood.

Today the winding narrow streets are lined with boutiques, artists' studios and cafes. The Suzanna Dellal Center, Tel Aviv's official dance center and home to the Bat-Sheva dance group, is located in the neighborhood. The Nahum Gutman museum is nearby. The old homes have been restored and there is a charming old world feel to the quaint serene


