From the Rabbi: Rabbi Michael Werbow

Hopefully you are all enjoying the beauty of summer. From what I have observed, the Shabbat morning services at TI don't suffer from much of a summer slump. Yes, it might be harder to find Torah readers and our numbers dip a small amount, but the energy is high and the spirit soars. It seems to me that maintaining this level throughout the summer is due to the same ideal that I experienced as a child: Judaism doesn't go on summer vacation.



When I was younger, and involved in Jr. Congregation at my childhood synagogue, many other families would not attend services if there wasn't Jr. Congregation due to vacations. This was true during the summer or other vacations like Thanksgiving and winter break. But my family, no matter the time of year, was always at Shabbat morning services.

This consistency has instilled in me the idea I mentioned before that

Bridge Builders: Sharon Cohen & Elliot Rosen - Sara Goldberg

Editor's note: This is the first in a series of Menorah articles featuring the stories of congregants who have made a commitment to TI's Bridge Campaign. To be highlighted, email TI's VP of Development, **Sara Goldberg** (sarag.tidc@gmail.com). We'd love to share your giving story!

How long and in what ways have you been connected to TI?

We joined TI shortly after Rabbi Seidel started. Our initial deep connection was through the five day a week nursery school that was run by TI at that time. Both of our children (Lillie and Joe) attended Himmelfarb School. Lillie along with Hannah Bergman and a couple of other teens insisted that there be a Hebrew High School and rebooted the USY. As a testament to the community life we had at TI, Lillie and her young family joined TI as members shortly before the pandemic.

Sharon: When we joined there was no kitchen staff other than the Executive Director who pulled together something quite modest (cottage cheese, cling peaches, and tabouli). In response, **Deena (Dugan)** and I organized a Thursday cooking event so that the food would be better, and they tied it to a birthday/anniversary celebration to get more donations for the kiddushim. Most of the parents of young children also ran k'tongregation every Shabbat. Joe and I also served as tutors for the Shepherd Park program.

Elliot: The annual retreat was enormously important to our family and our circle of friends. I was the retreat coordinator for four years in a row. Again, like the kitchen back then, there was no staff to do all the leg work. It was all organized and conducted by congregants of all ages and backgrounds. Of course, the education and youth directors, Lynn Golub-Rofrano and Lynn Berk, organized activities for the children at the retreat.

Elliot: Within about six months of joining, I was recruited to the Board and elected Finance VP, a role I had for two years. Then I became Admin VP for the next eight years. During all of this, I became "apprentice" to Jeremy Goldberg who taught me all the ins and outs of the building including that taking care of the building was not just a necessity but to do it well it had to be a labor of love. During the ATID renovation around 2000, I was at the building almost daily before heading off to work. Lillie's bat mitzvah took place in the midst of construction with plastic sheeting everywhere. It was a terrific and memorable time.

Sharon: I continued to enjoy Shabbat morning services, especially the uplifting moments of communal singing and chatting with friends at the upgraded kiddush lunches. For a few years, after being inspired by a talk that **Shelley Heller** and **Marcia Goldberg** gave at a retreat, I participated in the Chevra Kadisha, but found that the irregular evening hours didn't fit my early morning teaching schedule. I also liked the classes that **Mollie Berch** taught on Sunday mornings about important Jewish women in the past and about Jewish-American women writers. I gave a few drashim when asked by **Madeline Nesse** or **Rabbi Seidel**. Serving on the Environment Committee (now the Green Committee) back in the early 2000's gave me the chance to meet different people and to move TI toward eliminating the use of plastic and styrofoam, and eventually to the universal composting program implemented in the last year.

Elliot: After our daughter Lillie and her family joined TI, I became reengaged and reenergized. Two years ago, I agreed to become a George Greenberg Building Preservation Trustee and last year, seeing no way out, agreed to rejoin the Board as House VP and have overseen the critical HVAC project.

For both of us, being active in a book group created by TI members 25 years ago has been another way we feel connected to the TI community.

What do you love most about TI?

We have been here through periods of intense change, congregational stress, and congregational coming together.

What we have loved is the sense and belief that we are contributing members of our community both in terms of labor and volunteering and very importantly contributing money in meaningful ways. Our success as a congregation during the 30 years we have been members has been a shared responsibility and a shared love of community.

What inspired you to make your gift/pledge to TI? We are both emotionally and financially heavily invested in TI. TI is in a complicated financial spot but compared to the challenges of other times we have had at TI, we can be set right if every household takes

seriously their responsibility as members of a community. We hope that our pledge will inspire others to reach deep and support the future of our community.

What do you most hope the Bridge Campaign can accomplish for TI?

We hope that the Bridge Campaign energizes the community in ways similar to ATID. ATID was a commitment to a vibrant future. We had to do it and it worked. The Bridge Campaign is the same. We have to do it. We hope more of our congregation will feel a similar commitment financially to sustain and grow our community.

What is your greatest hope for TI's future?

We hope that in 30 years when our children are in their 60's that they will look back at this time with the same appreciation that we look back at our commitment to our TI community.

Anything else you think could be good to include?

Elliot: In September, I will be offering tours of the building to show off our solar panels, our classroom heat pumps, and all the shiny new HVAC equipment in the basement and the attic.
