A word from the Rabbi

PARSHAT TERUMAH - WHAT IS HOLY?

In this week's Parsha we read of the command to build the Mishkan, a temporary and portable Temple. (The Mishkan operated from the time of the giving of the Torah at Sinai, until the building of the actual Temple in Jerusalem a few hundred years later.)

The concept of a Temple, at least in principle, is to serve as a Holy place. The word Holy is one difficult to define, but in some way or another it refers to something being different, a different place, a different time, a different thing or a different kind of person.

A holy place is one that is different and elevated in comparison with others. It demands that we conduct ourselves differently there- in behaviour, in language and in dress.

The Torah's definition of developmental maturity is when "a child can distinguish between a nut and a rock". The ability to sense difference signals maturity. While this is true superficially, it is equally true regarding spiritual maturity. A person who can distinguish between a place of holiness and that of a mundane nature exposes their spiritual maturity.

We need to develop a maturity to differentiate our behaviour when we find ourselves in a Holy place. We need to curb our language when in the presence of Holy people, whether they be our parents or our teachers. We need to check our conduct with the setting of the sun on a Friday that ushers in the Holy Shabbat. Can we sense the difference?

Our sensitivity dictates our maturity.
