POT KOSHERING—THURSDAY NIGHT, APRIL 18TH, 8PM

- Bring your largest pots to the shul to kasher them for Pesach. You can then return home and kosher your smaller vessels.
- Please make sure that your pots are scrubbed clean, with no residue inside or outside. (see the Koshering procedures document above for information on what can be koshered)

SALE OF CHAMETZ—POWER OF ATTORNEY

- First, a key message. Give away your chametz, consume it, or discard/destroy it. That's what we are meant to do before Pesach. This is especially the case for "chametz gamur", straight out chametz of wheat, rye, oats, spelt and barley. A notable exception might be an expensive bottle of scotch, or other situations of significant financial loss.
- That being said, chametz can be sold, and Rabbi Marder (or his designee), is available to represent you.
