A FEW WORDS FROM RAV BARRY To Be Halachic and Inclusive



It seems that "inclusion" has resurfaced as a buzzword in the Conservative Jewish world. "Inclusion" as a value is mentioned in our Tefilot at the very beginning of Yom Kippur. We say: "Anu matirin lihitpalel im ha-avaryonim—we hereby declare it permissible to pray with (lit. the criminals) those who have gone astray." From the outset of the Day of Atonement we

proclaim that there's a seat for everyone in Shul.

It is also a central value of Pesach. Here are three examples:

1. In biblical times the Torah (Shmot 12:3-4) instructed the Israelites: "On the tenth of this month, let each one take a lamb for each parental home, a lamb for each household. But if the household is too small for a lamb, then he and his neighbor who is nearest to his house shall take [one] according to the number of people, each one according to one's ability to eat, shall you be counted for the lamb."

The Torah is teaching that there are two levels of inclusion—one is concerned with the household. The Torah instructs that the entire family take part in the festive meal. The second level deals with the neighborhood or the community. The Torah emphasizes that if the family is unable to consume the lamb or perhaps lacks the wherewithal to purchase one's own lamb, there's an option for a partnership with a neighbor, lest one think he/she is excluded from the Paschal ritual. The Torah provides an inclusive solution. Even a small or a poor family isn't excluded from performing the Mitzvah of the Korban Pesach (the Paschal Sacrifice) and celebrating the festival.

2. Our Hagaddah begins with an announcement: "Kol Dichfin Yetei V'yeichol!"—Let all who are hungry come and eat.

We actually call out an invitation to all, saying, "no one will be left alone tonight; all are included."

So, should you ask what's the "ta'am" of saying

this at the last minute, after the Seder has been prepared and everyone has sat down? I suggest that we say it as our annual pledge and obligation to always include guests at the Seder table.

3. The section of the four sons teaches us that when it comes to Pesach, no one is excluded from the Mitzvah of retelling the Sipur Yetziat Mitzraim—the Exodus story. The Midrash of the four sons reminds us that it may be easy to conveniently forget the "evil" child or the "tam", who may say something silly or insignificant. The child who has nothing to say may even be ignored and left in his room to sit there alone in total silence. At the Seder this will never be the case. "Inclusion" is celebrated as the wise son will sit with his three other "brothers" because they all have a seat at the table.

Notwithstanding the pro-inclusion messages of Yom Kippur and Pesach, dealing with questions of inclusion in the Synagogue is often a difficult task. However, even if we meticulously "stick to our halachic guns", there is a source we could learn from. It is said that Rabbi Haskell Lookstein taught that in addition to the standard four sections of the Shulchan Aruch (Code of Jewish Law) there is a fifth, "which must be at the foundation of the other four, and its topic is 'Menschlichkeit'" (quoted by Prof. Adam Ferziger).

In order to be an inclusive Shul, we don't need policy decisions from the main office. When sensitive halachic issues are handled by Rabbis who make decisions in a seriously Halachic way, which are accompanied by compassion and menchluchkeit, Shuls will find Halachically sound ways to be more inclusive.

If done this way, Shuls will be able to proudly proclaim:

כל הבא- ברוך הבא

Kol ha-ba; Baruch Ha-ba. Everyone who comes in, is welcome. Be'emet! Truthfully! Pesach Kasher, Inclusive, V'sameach!

PRESCHOOL PRESS

Preschool and kindergarten are so much more than science, math, and acquiring reading skills. Giving the children the opportunity to acquire the thinking skills necessary to succeed in school is a creative on-going process in our classrooms.

The hands-on science projects and experiments that engage children and encourage their natural curiosity are the fun ways that learning by doing is a daily occurrence in the classrooms. We do not want to prepare our children to be the "worker bees". We plan our days to encourage curiosity and problem solving. We hope to prepare our children to be the thinkers, leaders, future problem solvers and innovators.

We also understand that acquiring healthy socialization skills is an essential component of a preschool and kindergarten experience which allows our students to become dependable, competent, productive, responsible, positive, and valuable members of a group while at play or during school activities. Many of our activities involve the children working in small groups cooperatively sharing information, ideas, and problem solving during tasks and activities.

We believe it is vital that our children are exposed to "The Arts." In addition to our preschool and kindergarten's regularly scheduled aerobics teacher, science specialist, music specialist, magical program reinforcement specialist, we also bring into the school other programs which we feel are valuable to enhance and reinforce our children's learning.

We had a second presentation from Classroom Adventure Stories. The children are led on a magical and imaginative adventure which is totally interactive. The children use their imaginations during the storytelling, but, they are engaged because the story is about THEM! The children are the characters in the story and they create the props using hand gestures, bodily actions, and sound effects. All of their names and the names of the staff are continually used throughout the story. The one major prop that is used is SNOW! On a 60 degree winter day, it was snowing real snow in the Karff Auditorium! No imagination was needed! Look at our photos!

We were fortunate to have the musicians from the LuLu Temple Shine Orchestra come to our school to present a program about many types of instruments, tempo, tone, and pitch. The orchestra leader is internationally acclaimed and frequently travels to China and Russia to conduct or to perform in their professional orchestras. The children loved the program, especially when they had the chance to try all of the instruments.

Two parents from our preschool and kindergarten family presented a program to our kindergarten students. The program was entitled "Safe and Unsafe Touching", which was a program designed to empower our students to keep themselves safe. Both parents are highly skilled, accomplished, and extraordinary women with highly recognized experience in the area of child sexual abuse. One of the women currently has worked in the Department of Human Services for 15 years and for the past 11 years has investigated *and* supervised other social workers investigating child sexual abuse.

Our other parent gained her experience while working as a patrol officer with the Philadelphia Police Department. Upon being promoted Detective in 1999, she began working for the Special Victims Unit, and specifically worked investigating cases of Child Sexual Abuse. She receives yearly training and she has been honored with several awards including one award from The National Center for Missing and Exploited Children where she met with President Bush in the Oval Office. also work together in a proactive way to educate children, their parents, and mandated reporters about the realities of child abuse. I am honored that both of these extraordinary women have offered this valuable program to our kindergarten class. We appreciative for their dedication to our children! We are dedicated to providing our students with as many skills as possible to aid their development across all domains and to keep them safe while in kindergarten and beyond!

Don't forget to sell your Chametz before Erev Pesach!

The Biblical Laws regarding Chametz include the following: Exodus 12:15-For seven days you shall eat unleavened cakes, but on the preceding day you shall clear away all leaven from your houses, for whoever eats leaven from the first day until the seventh day that soul shall be cut off from Israel.

<u>Deuteronomy 16:4</u>- And no leaven shall be seen with you within all your border for seven days; neither shall any of the flesh you slaughter on the preceding day in the afternoon, remain all night until the morning.

Exodus 13:3- Moses said to the people, "Remember this day, when you went out of Egypt, out of the house of bondage, for with a mighty hand, the Lord took you out of here, and [therefore] no leaven shall be eaten.

Exodus 12:20- You shall not eat any leavening; throughout all your dwellings you shall eat unleavened cakes.

From these Biblical verses the Rabbis have instructed that:

- 1. We shouldn't have Chametz in our possession during Pesach.
- 2. Chametz shouldn't be eaten during Pesach
- 3. Chametz shouldn't be seen during Pesach.
- 4. No benefit could be derived from Chametz on Pesach.

Therefore, if one can't consume or get rid of all the Chametz in the house before Pesach, (especially that great bottle of Single Malt Scotch in the liquor cabinet) one can sell the Chametz to a non Jew as the Rambam, Maimonides (13th Century) wrote:

Rambam - Laws of Chametz and Matza 4:6, based on Tosefta Pesachim 2:6-A Jew and a gentile are traveling together in a ship, and the Jew possesses Chametz. When the fifth hour [on the fourteenth of Nisan] arrives--behold, he should sell it to the gentile or give it to him as a present. He may return and buy it back from him after Pesach, as long as he gives it to him as an outright present.

2017. We hope you can donate to this worthy cause.



Imagine how strong the winds were blowing, how the clouds and fire were flying thru the air. The lightning was frightening; the loud thunder vibrated and the multitude shook with fear. Then thru the fire El Shaddai's voice rang down from the mountain top to each of the survivors. Later Moses came down to them with his two tablets and his face glowed with holy light!

We were cringing slaves then, recently freed from harsh Egyptian bondage. We remember the ten plagues and now we each feel the excitement and glory of freedom. After we lost our first Temple we have been tormented and forced to move from place to place. But now that has changed. Those old Hebrews have become Jews and we finally returned home.

You skeptics, atheists and naysayers; what other ancient nation has survived intact as we? We speak and pray in Hebrew; we still follow the lunar calendar, and many now live in Israel. True, it is hard to understand our indiscernible God; but He has spoken to us and cared for us, Hashem has also punished us but over the millennia our God has behaved like parents to us.

When we go to Shul on Shabbat and enter to put on our Tallit we are somehow transformed. Our worldly concerns fade away and we go on a mystical journey into the world of prayer and Torah. When we stand, we all stand together with Hashem and our lives are somehow enhanced. Many of us have tears in our eyes and emotion in our voices as we chant and sing.

Our flesh and blood is the same as all the others, but our ethical system has been customized. From Sinai's ten we now live by many hundreds of do's and not do's that we call Halacha. From our circumcision to the middle of our forehead we are tied to our heritage and God. We are required to learn, to question and to serve our society with ethics and humility.

As we have recently seen; some Americans still cling to strong racial, sexual and ethnic prejudices. For them the old laws of the jungle still override common sense and the principles of social responsibility. But I strongly believe that the truths and wisdom of our Torah lead us to a better tomorrow. These Revelations at Mt. Sinai and the wisdom of our Rabbis provide for us the way to better ourselves as Jews!




